


Wood Screw - Actual size 2 columns (16X) 4 columns (32X)

In an open area, align the ladders with the bottle supports facing inward. Align the large gaps on both ladders. The end with the larger gap will be the top of your rack.




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IMPORTANT NOTE: To prevent splitting of the ladders, drill a 1/16" pilot hole before driving the wood screws. For optimal results, initially drive the screws partially using a drill, then complete tightening manually.




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
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
Rotate the unit and attach the front and back connectors to the bottom side of the unit.

Ensure that the unit is stable and all connections are secure. Carefully move the assembled unit into its final position.

Care Instructions

- Do not use chemical cleaners or abrasive cleaning materials, as they may damage the surface.
- Do not place hot items on surfaces.
- Use coasters to avoid water rings.
- Only place dry bottles on and inside the cabinet to protect against marks and stains.

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Cellar Installation Guide

Cellar Installation Guide

After assembling all the modules, begin stacking them in place, starting from the bottom layer and working your way up. For cellar installations using the base platform and end panels, before stacking the units, ensure that the units placed directly on the base platform are recessed by 11/16" from each end to properly accommodate the end panels.

Ensure that each module is properly aligned and squared. Due to the natural characteristics of hardwood, slight warping or uneven lines may occur. In most cases, these imperfections will be hidden once the trim is installed. For secure assembly, use a finishing nailer to join the modules together at each vertical seam.


To prevent shifting or sliding, each module must be securely fastened to the wall. Align the wall anchor brackets in the desired position. It is recommended to use at least 2 wall brackets for each module. Secure the brackets to the wall using drywall or wood screws. Then, attach the brackets to the unit with ½" screws, ensuring they do not penetrate through the unit.

NOTE: Determine the material of the wall before selecting the appropriate hardware. The kit includes both wood screws and drywall anchors for your convenience.

Drywall Anchor Instructions

Using a #2 Phillips screwdriver, gently press the anchor tip into the drywall to position it.

Apply pressure and rotate the anchor until it is flush with the drywall surface. Avoid overtightening.

Place the screw through the item to be mounted, then insert it into the anchor.

As you tighten the screw, the anchor will produce a "click" sound when the screw is halfway in, indicating the anchor is secure. Continue tightening the screw until it is flush with the surface. Note: The provided screw accommodates item thicknesses of 1/4 inch or less.
