

Assembly Instructions for Split Pedstal Style Table

Pieces

Table Top Center Pedestal 2) Outer Pedestal Halves and Feet Extensions (if applicable)



1/2" Wrench Blanket



Instructions:

For the protection of your table, lay your pieces on a blanket during assembly. Make sure the two outer pedestals are latched together and the core pedestal is removed from the center of the base.

Flip over the base so the bolts are on the ground and attach the legs. Once all the feet are attached flip over the base so the feet are on the ground.

Underneath the table, there will be a lock that keeps the base together. Make sure the lock is disengaged. Also, remove all the hardware from the bolts on the top of the pedestal. With the help from another person, lift the table top onto the pedestal base.




Here are some helpful hints:

Have a third person help guide the table top on the appropriate bolts.

The table top seam and the seam of the base have to be aligned.

4. Once the table top is on the base, spread the table top apart until the mounting plates are exposed. There should be a metal ring that is sticking out from between one of the outer pedestal mounting plates and the center mounting plate. Attach the washers and nuts. Make sure you don't over tighten the nuts- they only need to be snug.

5. Unlatch the hooks that are on either side of the pedestal (see picture to the right) and pull up on the metal hook by the mounting plates (this must be done after the hooks are unlatched). This will cause the pedestal base to move apart slightly.

6. Spread the table apart until there is a wide enough opening to slide the center pedestal in.

7. Tip one side of the table up slightly- just enough to slide the center pedestal underneath the mounting plate. Secure it with the nuts and washers. Make sure you don't over tighten the nuts.

8. You can either keep extending the table to add the extensions or you can close it up and keep it at its base size.



Things to note:

The pedestal will need to split when you add three extensions or more.

We suggest you keep the base latched if you are going to have less than 3 extensions in the table.

The table will shift over the base so you may need to adjust the top so that it is centered over the base.
