
the double-powered flashlight!

Josh and Jeff never forgot that camping trip or the power of God's Word and the need to


study it every day.



DIMMERS AND BRIGHTS

Josh and Jeff could not wait until they were old enough to drive! They were practicing and learning all they could so when the day ever came, they would be ready! Riding in Dad's truck, they continually pestered him with questions about everything from the wheels to the wipers and all the parts in between.

"Pay attention to the lights," Dad warned. "If one is out, you might be stopped by a patrolman. Without lights there is no way you can drive at night. You use the "dimmers" to see the road close up, pot holes, bumps, or trash, and to protect an oncoming car. If you shine the high beam lights in the driver's face, you will blind him so he cannot see the road. He could run into you or run off the road! It's very dangerous and also impolite.

When you have an open road, switch to the "brights." They light the way into the distance revealing obstacles and dangers—animals, fallen tree limbs, warning signs (sharp curve, narrow bridge, bridge out, etc.). It's much like

your camping light. The low beam showed you the area near your tent, and the high beam showed what was lurking out in the woods. Lights are warning and protection."

God's Word is the best light. "Thy word is a lamp unto my feet, and a light unto my path" (Ps. 119:105). Read it; treasure it; depend on it!
