## KIDZ HEROES Fanny (Francis Jane) Crosby

Fanny Crosby made a stepping stone out of a stumbling block! She became blind at only six weeks old, but she grew up to be an "overcomer" and blessing.

When she was born in 1820, there was little help for a "handicapped" child. She could not go to regular school. She could not see to read, but her grandmother spent hours reading to her and teaching her God's Word. Fanny had a quick mind and

memorized all she could, including the Books of Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, and the four Gospels in one year, and the next year she memorized many psalms, all of Proverbs, Ruth, and the Song of Solomon. She learned to play the organ, piano, and harp. When she was only eight years old, she wrote this poem:



will keep me, provide my needs and bring me peace, then God will be my God, and I will give Him a tenth of all I have."

That was at least a step forward for Jacob, but, you see, we can't bargain with God that way. We don't say, "If God does this, I'll do that." That was like Jacob bargaining with Esau—"If you give me your birthright, I'll give you the pottage." No, we come to God God's way, or not at all. Salvation is all of God's grace. Jacob finally learned that, but he had some tough experiences in the process.

Our way only leads to ruin, death, and Hell. God stands in heaven able to receive you because of the Lord Jesus Christ. His death for sin on earth on the cross is our only ladder to Heaven. Receive His FREE GIFT by turning from sin and accepting Christ as your only Savior. "The GIFT of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord" (Romans 6:23b).

He eats almost anything, including nuts, fruits, fish, frogs, birds, and garbage. His nimble fingers can twist handles, open doors, and pick up food. But he likes to wash his food in water before he eats it—no sand or grit for him, please! Kidz also should wash their hands before eating!

Raccoons build their nests in hollow trees or logs. The "kits" are blind for their first three weeks but grow quickly and soon develop stripes on their faces and rings on their tails. They look very cuddly, but they know how to fight ferociously and survive in spite of predators and some people who consider them pests.

We should be not just strong survivors, but victorious for the Lord. We can learn from Mr. Raccoon to fight for the Lord and not let the devil or any who do not love the Lord defeat us. We should keep standing for Christ and the Bible whatever happens. The heroes of faith listed in Hebrews 11 were "valiant in fight," and Paul told Timothy to "fight the good fight of faith" (I Tim. 6:12). Don't let anything or anyone back you off from standing true to the Lord Jesus Christ.

At age 15, She went to the New York Institution for the Blind. She learned braille but did not do it well as she had learned guitar when young and it calloused her fingers to feel the finely raised alphabet. She was an excellent student though, and later became a teacher there. She thought being a teacher was "finer" than being a student!

After she was saved, she gave her talents entirely to the Lord. She never received much pay for all her poems, but God will reward her. She wrote over 6,000 hymns and poems. Some favorites are "Blessed Assurance", "Safe in the Arms of Jesus", and "I Am Thine, O Lord." Look in your hymn book and see how many of her songs you can find. And no matter what difficulties or handicaps you may have, Jesus has something for you to do!
