



Goldilocks' bear family had Papa, Mama, and Baby Bear. The Peafowl family has Papa Peacock, Mama Peahen, and Baby Peachick. They are some of the most beautiful birds God created! Their blues, greens, golds and other colors are magnificent, and every tail feather has a bold, black "spot" surrounded by lustrous hues. A peacock is the size of a small turkey and can be six feet long from his head to the tip of his tail feathers! How he can fly with such a long tail is amazing, and when that tail stands up and spreads out into a huge fan, everybody notices, especially his mate! He really


"struts his stuff!" He may strut quietly, but when he "speaks", you may run for your life! His high-pitched call sounds like someone screaming in mortal fear!

a boy, George As Washington wrote in his notebook, Rule #54 – "Play not the peacock." He was to dress modestly and neatly but not "strut" or attract attention to himself. We should not show off either but should show forth the Lord Jesus Christ.

Peacocks eat many things - grain, insects, berries, frogs, etc. They never screw up their faces and moan, "Ooh, I don't like that!" They are thankful for whatever the Lord provides.

In Bible times, peacocks were a sign of great wealth. King Solomon's huge navy went on an expedition every three years to bring him "gold, and silver, ivory, and apes, and peacocks" (I Kgs. 10:22). But we know that "the blessing of the Lord, it maketh rich" (Prov. 10:22).

The peacock is the national bird of India and is sacred to Hindus. They believe the "spots" on the tail symbolize the eyes of the gods. They do not know the true God of



the Bible who sees everything. "The eyes of the Lord are in every place, beholding the evil and the good" (Prov. 15:3). They worship the bird God created instead of the God Who created it! May we be quick to tell the Gospel story, for some have never heard!
