God made some peculiar animals, but they are interesting teachers. The ant and spider show us how we should be, but the sloth shows us how we should not be. When someone is slow and lazy, folks say they are slothful. Hebrews 6:12 says, "...be not slothful." Why should we not be as the sloth? What ails the poor fellow?

God gave the sloth an extremely low body temperature, so when it moves-if it moves-it is in slow motion. It looks rather odd, too. It has almost no tail, no ears, a blunt nose, and teeth like pegs. It lives in trees hanging upside-down on branches by its hook-like claws. It eats, sleeps, and even has its babies while hanging upside down. It almost never comes down to the ground, and rarely moves. If it does move, it is ever so *s-l-o-w-l-y*, so slowly in fact, that algae often grows on its long coarse hair.
