BREAD IN THE WILDERNESS (Mark 8:1-9)

For three days the multitude stayed with Jesus out in the mountain. They brought sick folks, blind, crippled, deaf, even ones who could not speak, and Jesus healed them all. It was wonderful, but they didn't get go home? You know they were hungry!

Yes, and Jesus knew they were hungry. Other teachers or leaders would have closed the meeting and sent them away, but not Jesus. He would not send them away hungry! When he asked the disciples about it, they were flabbergasted! There were no stores to buy bread for so many people even if they had money!

"How many loaves do you have?" Jesus asked. "Only 7 loaves and 3 fishes!" they answered.

Jesus stilled the crowd and told them to sit down on the ground. (He always did everything in an orderly manner.) Then He took the loaves and fish, thanked His Heavenly Father for them, and began breaking them and giving them to the disciples to give to the people.

He kept breaking and they kept giving out, and the people kept eating until everyone had eaten—not just a little taste—they ate until they were full! Absolutely satisfied! That's not all. The disciples gathered up seven baskets full of food left over. Jesus would not allow any to be wasted. What a day! People heard Jesus' teachings, were healed of all their ailments, and also had their tummies filled. Jesus satisfied every need.

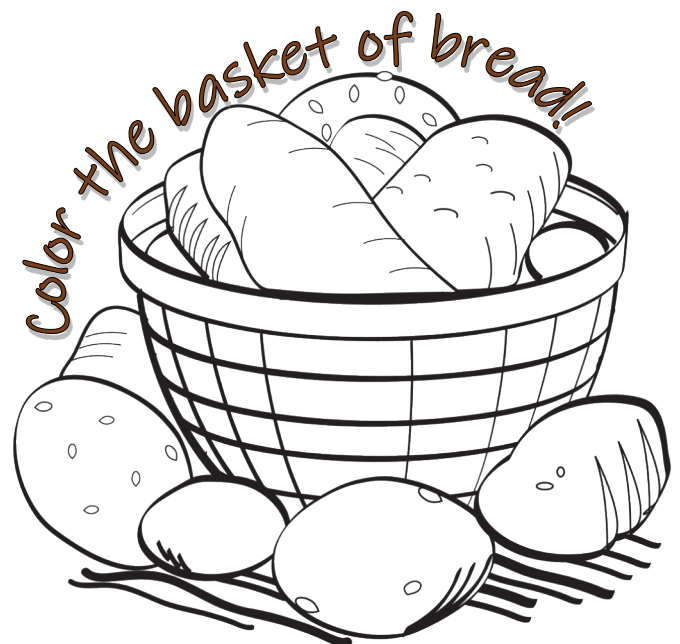



Circle the names of the Four Gospels in the Word Search below. (Hint: The first four books of the New Testament are called The Gospels.)

hides under the sand at the bottom of his pit. When an ant comes close to the edge, the soft sand slides away under its feet, and the ant falls into the pit. Then the doodlebug kills the ant with his long, sharp jaws and sucks the juices out of his body! How vicious! How cruel!

That funny, innocent looking doodlebug is really a mortal enemy of the ant! No wonder his real name is the "Ant Lion," for he traps his unsuspecting prey and kills it. That reminds us of a Bible warning. 1 Peter 5:8 says, "Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil, as a roaring lion, walketh about, seeking whom he may devour." The devil may come with a temptation that seems harmless and appealing, but his soft slide will bring you to his pit in hell unless you resist him, repent of your sin, and turn in faith and obedience to the Lord. Then as a Christian, God says "Resist the devil, and he will flee from you (James 4:7)." *The next time you see a doodlebug, remember his real name and the warning he gives us.*

That teasing alarm is sounded by many a boy or girl watching intently as a funny doodlebug walks around and around backwards pushing his tail like a shovel down into the dry sand. If a child nudges him with a little stick, he rolls into a ball in self defense but soon again starts bulldozing down into the sand behind him. When the sand slides up over his back, he gives his head a sudden jerk, and the sand flies off to one side. With each circle he makes, the funnel shaped hole gets smaller and deeper, becoming a pit. Sometimes his pit can be two inches across and more than an inch deep. Then Mr. Doodlebug

GYPSY SMITH, Beloved Evangelist

Rodney Smith's life was not like others at all. Born in a forest near London, he lived in a gypsy wagon. His mother made baskets to sell. His father played his violin in pubs, and little Rodney danced and then held out his hat to collect money for entertaining the people. But when he was age sixteen, he went forward at a Gospel meeting and got saved! Someone whispered, "Oh, it's only a Gipsy boy," but Jesus changed Rodney's life! He got a Bible, an English dictionary, and a Bible dictionary and carried them everywhere. People laughed at him, but he said, "Never mind. Someday I'll be able to read them, and I'm going to preach, too." He taught himself to read and write. Rodney had a beautiful voice. He sang hymns and became known as the "singing gipsy boy." At age 17, he began preaching the Gospel. Someone gave him the name "Gipsy" and it stuck. He preached to poor, to the rich, elite and royalty. Self-educated, he once said, "I didn't go through your colleges and seminaries. They wouldn't have me...but I have been to the feet of Jesus where the only true scholarship is learned." He crossed oceans over forty times singing and telling of salvation through the blood of Jesus Christ. He may have been "only a Gipsy boy," but God used him to win countless souls to the Savior. *Remember, whoever you are, God can use you to win souls to Jesus, too, if you will yield your life to Him!*
