

Locusts belong to the grasshopper family. They thrive in warm weather, but when winter and cold weather come, the locusts hide and go numb. When the weather gets warm, they get moving again!

Locusts love green salads! With their cutting jaws that nip off leaves, grass, and even bark of trees, they eat enormous servings! They travel in great swarms and can cover a field like a blanket, eating it down to nothing. Sometimes the swarms are so large, they block out the sun. They can devour and destroy whole crops over thousands of acres, then keep on marching and chomping. The damage they can do is immeasurable!

God used a plague of locusts to force Pharaoh to let His people leave Egypt. The insects attacked and devoured until there was nothing green left! (Ex. 10:8-20). One locust alone is of little note, but when they "go forth all of them by bands" (Prov. 30:27) they do a vast work. As a Christian, we may not feel that we can accomplish much for the Lord, but if <u>all</u> of us *pray* much, *witness* often, and *give* freely to God's work, we could see God do great things for His glory!

We also need to examine ourselves to see that we do not grow cold in heart and numb to God's Word. Come to Him daily in His Word and prayer. Let the "Sun of Righteousness" warm our hearts and move us to serve Him in the new year.
