

PATTERN NOTES.

RECIPE FOR CARE.

This yarn is designed to have a low pilling* quotient however, its tough to avoid forever. Pilling occurs as a natural result of friction. A careful snip with scissors will restore your item to its original glory. If required, gently hand wash in cold water then lay flat in the shade to dry.

Handle with care and try not to bring into contact with sharp objects.

*Pilling does not constitute a defect

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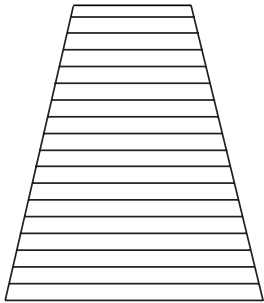

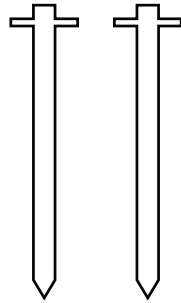
cable plait throw.

approximately 100cm x 130cm

ingredients.



4 x 2ply bumps



1 x set of 45mm needles
plus 1 x needle for display

abbreviations.

K - Knit

P - Purl

C6F - six-stitch left-twisting cable

recipe.

cast on 30 stitches

row 1 - k1, p1, k1, p6, k1, p1, k1, p6, k1, p1, k1, p6, k1, p1, k1

row 2 - p1, k1, p1, k6, p1, k1, p1, k6, p1, k1, p1, k6, p1, k1, p1

row 3 - repeat row 1

row 4 - repeat row 2

row 5 - repeat row 1

row 6 - repeat row 2

row 7 - repeat row 1

row 8 - k1, p1, k1, c6f, k1, p1, k1, c6f, k1, p1, k1, c6f, k1, p1, k1

rows 9-24 - repeat rows 1-8 twice

rows 25-31 - repeat rows 1-7

cast off

c6f - slip 3 sts onto cable stitch holder and hold to front. K next 3 sts, then k3 off cable stitch holder
