<b>Types of Pacman Frogs</b>	Green, Albino, and Designer
<b>Habitat</b>	10 Gal Terrarium with Screen Lid
<b>Temp Range</b>	72° - 82°F
<b>Substrate</b>	Coconut Fiber
<b>Hides</b>	Live Plants, Pothos, or English Ivy
<b>Lighting</b>	Flourescent Lighting
<b>Diet</b>	Crickets & Other Insects, 1 - 2x / Month Calcium Supplements
<b>Water Source</b>	Non-Chlorinated Water Bowl
<b>Humidity</b>	50% - 80%
<b>Handling</b>	Not Recommended; Can Be Aggressive
<b>Max Size</b>	4" - 7" Females, 2.5" - 4" Males
<b>Life Span</b>	Up to 15 Years

## HELPFUL TIPS

- + These frogs are not very active. They spend a lot of time waiting for food.
- + Babies can be kept in small, plastic reptile enclosures
- + Provide enough substrate. They love to burrow and sit with just their eyes showing.
- + Pacman may encase itself in a tough outer skin to protect it from drying out. They will not move and can be mistaken for dead.
