SPEARHEAD TRAILS TRAIL PULES

TRAIL RULES (MOTORIZED AND NON-MOTORIZED UNLESS SPECIFIED)

- All trail users and passengers shall have a valid SRRA trail waiver and be able to produce proof of purchase via receipt or confirmation e-mail as proof of permit if stopped by an SRRA Trail Ranger.
- If a rider receives a ticket for failure to prove permit verification but can prove they had a valid permit when the ticket was issued, the ticket may be revoked by the SRRA staff. Call 276-807-7581.
- If an SRRA Trail Ranger or law enforcement officer requests to see permits, all riders in the machine must be able to produce proof of permit.
- Riders must produce a state issued or photo ID matching permit name.
- Trail riders must wear a DOT, SNELL or other Virginia state approved helmet.
- All riders in the machine must wear a helmet.
- · Eye protection is required.
- Trails are open from sunrise to sunset unless otherwise designated.
- Trails may be closed or rerouted for any reason deemed appropriate or as needed for maintenance and/or safety reasons. Please see www.spearheadtrails.com for current Spearhead Trails closures.
- Trail closures are also posted to the official Spearhead Trails Facebook.
- If a trail is closed via signage, it is unlawful to ignore signage.
- It is unlawful to damage, take or alter trail signage or SRRA locks.
- Riders and operators are required to follow manufacturers' minimum age requirements for each machine. Know your specific
 machine requirements and rules.
- The number of passengers per machine is limited to the number of seatbelts available.
- Speed limit for all Spearhead Trails is 25 mph.
- Reckless operation of machines is prohibited.
- Persons under the age of 18 must be accompanied by a legal guardian or parent with a valid Spearhead Trails permit and waiver.
- All riders are required to stop when signaled or asked by an SRRA Trail Ranger or law enforcement officer.
- Drug and alcohol use is prohibited on all Spearhead Trails.
- Firearms and fireworks are prohibited on all Spearhead Trails.
- Riders and operators are required to stay on marked trails and vonly enter and exit trail systems at a trail access point.
- Riders shall stay out of all water areas not designated as play areas.
- Dogs must be leashed on Spearhead Trails property and facilities.
- Do not build or start fires for any reason on Spearhead Trails.
- Littering is prohibited. Pack out what you pack in.
- Park only in designated areas.
- Spearhead Trails and the SRRA are not responsible for lost or stolen property.
- Do not stop, stand or loiter in gas well or equipment locations.
- · Photography of equipment, gas wells, structures, or other commercial equipment on trails whatsoever.
- All Spearhead Trails, facility and property are subject to surveillance.
- · Highway vehicles are only allowed at specified trail systems. See www.spearheadtrails.com for approved trails.
- Machines shall be equipped with a steering wheel from the manufacturer, a Roll-Over Protection System and seatbelts in good working order.
- Machines must not be self-constructed.
- Green trails are our easiest trails (beginner), blue trails are more difficult and black are the most difficult. Yellow trails are for experts only. Riders are responsible for knowing their abilities.

OFF-HIGHWAY VEHICLES (OHV) TRAIL RULES

- Off-highway vehicles (OHVs) are only allowed on approved trails. OHVs includes machines in 4x4 mode. See www.spear headtrails.com for a list of approved trails for OHVs.
- All OHVs must be currently registered by a state department of motor vehicles.
- All operators must have a current operators licensed approved by a state department of motor vehicles.
- · Riders may not ride in the beds of trucks.
- Operators and passengers must be in a manufacturer approved seat with seat-belt fastened.
- Operators are responsible for removing damaged vehicles from the trails. Spearhead Trails / the SRRA must be notified immediately of a damaged or disabled vehicle.
- Operators are responsible for containment and cleanup of any spilled fluids or glass and Spearhead Trails / the SRRA must be notified.
- Bicycles are allowed on OHV trails.

EQUINE TRAIL RULES

- An equine approved helmet is required for all riders.
- A negative Coggins test is required for all equines using the trails and proof of the test should be available should a Trail Ranger or law enforcement officer request.
- All equines must have a health certificate, including our of state equines.
- Equine trails are for equine only. Bicycles, ATVs and OHVs are not allowed.
