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Rnd 20: Ch 2, * hdc2tog; rep from * around, join with sl st—10 sts.

FOR SIZE LONLY

Rnds 8–15: Ch 2, hdc around, join with sl st—72 sts.

Rnd 16: Ch 2, * 4 hdc, hdc2tog; rep from * around, join with sl st—60 sts.

Rnd 17: Ch 2, * 4 hdc, hdc2tog; rep from * around, join with sl st—50 sts.

Rnd 18: Ch 2, * 3 hdc, hdc2tog; rep from * around, join with sl st—40 sts.

Rnd 19: Ch 2, * 2 hdc, hdc2tog; rep from * around, join with sl st—30 sts.
Rnd 20: Ch 2, * 1 hdc, hdc2tog; rep from * around, join with sl st—20 sts.
Rnd 21: Ch 2, * hdc2tog; rep from * around, join with sl st—10 sts.

FINISHING

Cut yarn leaving a tail for sewing and sew the remaining hole closed.







Rnd 2: Ch 2, (hdc in next st, 2 hdc in next st) around, join with sl st—24 sts.

Rnd 3: Ch 2, (hdc in next 2 sts, 2 hdc in next st) around, join with sl st—32 sts.

Rnd 4: Ch 2, (hdc in next 3 sts, 2 hdc in next st) around, join with sl st—40 sts.

Rnds 5-14: Ch 2, hdc around, join with sl st—40 sts.

Rnds 15 and 16 (Jade): With two strands of yarn held together, ch 2, hdc around, join with sl st—40 sts.





















With Cream, work around the snout in sc, working 4 sc at tip of nose.

RACCOON

Row 1: With Cream, ch 2, sc in 2nd ch from hk, ch 1—1 st.

Row 2: 3 sc in first st, ch 1—3 sts.

Row 3: 2 sc in first st, sc in next st, 2 sc in last st, ch 1—5 sts.

Row 4 (Stone): 2 sc in first st, 3 sc, 2 sc in last st, ch 1—7 sts.

Row 5: 2 sc in first st, 5 sc, 2 sc in last st, ch 1—9 sts.

Row 6 (Cream): Sc across, ch 1—9 sts.

Row 7: Sc2tog, 5 sc, sc2tog, ch 1—7 sts.

For the first eye, work as follows:

Row 7: 2 sc, ch 1, turn—2 sts.

Row 8 (Stone): 2 sc. ch 1. turn—2 sts.

Row 9: Ch 2, sk 1 st, sl st in last sk.

Continue crocheting sc around the head working

4 sc at tip of nose. Work 2nd eye as follows:

Row 8: 2 sc, ch 1, turn—2 sts.

Row 9: Ch 2, sk 1 st, sl st in last sk.

Fasten off and cut yarn.

FINISHING

Glue beads onto head for eyes. Sew or glue heads onto hair barrettes.







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WHIP STITCH



Whip stitch is worked evenly along the edges of two pieces, with the pieces lined up as shown with WS facing you. Connect the pieces at the corner with a stitch, inserting the needle from front to back on one piece and then poking back to front on the other piece. Repeat once more.



Now insert the needle through the "bars" of the next two crochet stitches, one from each piece, as shown, and pull through.



Continue this way to join the "bars" of each pair of stitches together, as shown.



On the RS, the stitches will be parallel to each other and slightly separated, with the seam barely visible between them.
