A quest on par with the search for the holy grail.




High Waisted Breeches

Unfortunate Seam Placement Breeches


These are for the purely masochistic and should probably be avoided by the general populace.




Poo soup... one more way to ruin your day. Because why shouldn't horses poop in little bowls of water too? Oh, yeah, because then we get to clean them. Ugh.


> Who knew steel shoes don't float? My horses are masters of losing things they don't like. Unfortunately, I'm less of a master at finding said things until they have begun to properly decay.


"Ah. Indeed."




Some are more painful than others.


famous Last Words:


When you ONLY have an Hour to Ride:

"Horse is very animated/spirited."


READ AS: He sees dead people and will frequently give you the opportunity to join them."

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"Always in the ribbons."


READ AS: They were mostly pink and green in shows with no more than 5 or 6 per class which is why we didn't specify her placings.

NEVER-ENDING.


