

## FIVEFOLD MENTORSHIP PROGRAMS FAQ

## WHO SHOULD APPLY FOR THE MENTOR PROGRAM?

Any students hoping to grow in their gifting are welcome to apply for a mentorship, but we especially encourage those who feel they are called as a Fivefold Prophet, Teacher, Pastor, Evangelist or Apostle. At the end of the mentor program students may be chosen to be commissioned, although participation in a mentorship is not a guarantee of commissioning.

WHAT IS THE TIME COMMITMENT OF PARTICIPATING IN A MENTORSHIP?

Depending on which mentorship you apply for, the average time commitment is 2-4 hours a week. There will be a weekly group video call with your mentor that will be an average of 45-90 minutes long, plus the extra reading and weekly assignments given by your mentor.
