

1. This test assesses intactness of the cerebellum and proprioception.

7. Drug of choice to treat severe vertigo.
9. This mouth movement can help to minimize pressure build up behind the tympanic membrane.
10. Clear fluid leaking from the auditory canal after a blow to the base of the skull.
11. Type of infection seen as black dots on the eardrum.
14. Bone involved in mastoiditis.
16. This test is contraindicated in a client with a perforated tympanic membrane.
