- 2. Normal troponin value is _____ than 0.6ng/ml.
- 4. The vena cava empties into this atrium of the heart.
- 6. These veins carry oxygenated blood.
- 8. Normal PSA level is less than this value.
- 9. A level of BNP that is higher than 300 is indicative of severe failure of this organ.
- 13. Plasma without the proteins which clot the blood.
- 14. This value is 40% to 54% in males and 38% 47% in females.
- 15. This lymphatic vessel (duct) is found on the left side of the body.
- 16. The P in BNP.
- **18.** Increased serum values of this mineral are seen with lithium toxicity and the use of antacids.
- 19. This serum level decreases during pregnancy and loss of muscle mass.

- 1. This pale yellow viscous fluid makes up 55% of the blood volume.
- 2. These nodes act as filters.
- 3. This hormone is decreased in adrenal insufficiency and panhypopituitarism.
- 5. Space surrounding the cells outside of the vascular system.
- 7. Salicylates, thiazide diuretics and this class of drug increase amylase levels.
- 10. This count is normally between the range of 5,000 10,000 cells per microliter.
- 11. Increased serum values of this mineral are seen with metastatic bone tumors and sarcoidosis.
- 12. Increased levels of this enzyme is associated with acute pancreatitis, renal disease and peptic ulcers.
- 14. This hormone is under 3 when not pregnant and rises significantly to 50,000 from four months to term.
- 17. This output is normally 1 ml per kg per hour.
