

Nikisha is a champ – barrier game



Materials: game grid and marker per player. Laminate game grid or put in plastic sleeve to reuse.

Instructions: Players sit back-to-back or with a barrier between them. Play the game like Battleships. Player A writes 5 words from the list on the grid, horizontally or vertically, with one letter in each square. Player B says a grid reference to find Player A's words, for example B10 or E7. For all hits, Player A tells Player B the letter for that grid square. Player B records the letter (or the miss) on their grid. Swap roles when all words are found.
