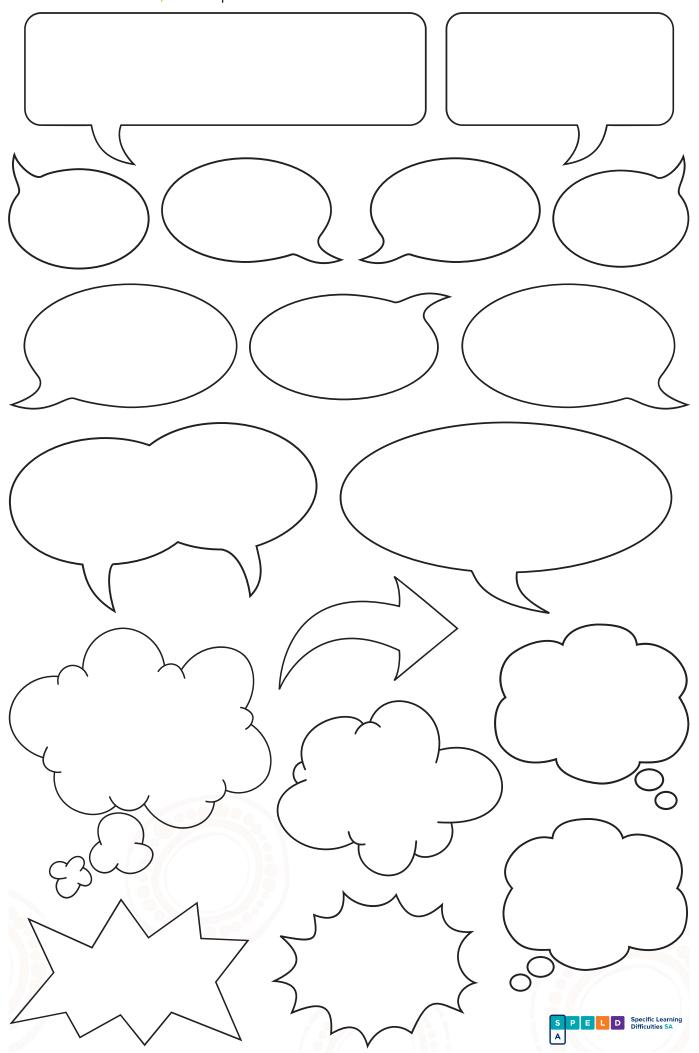

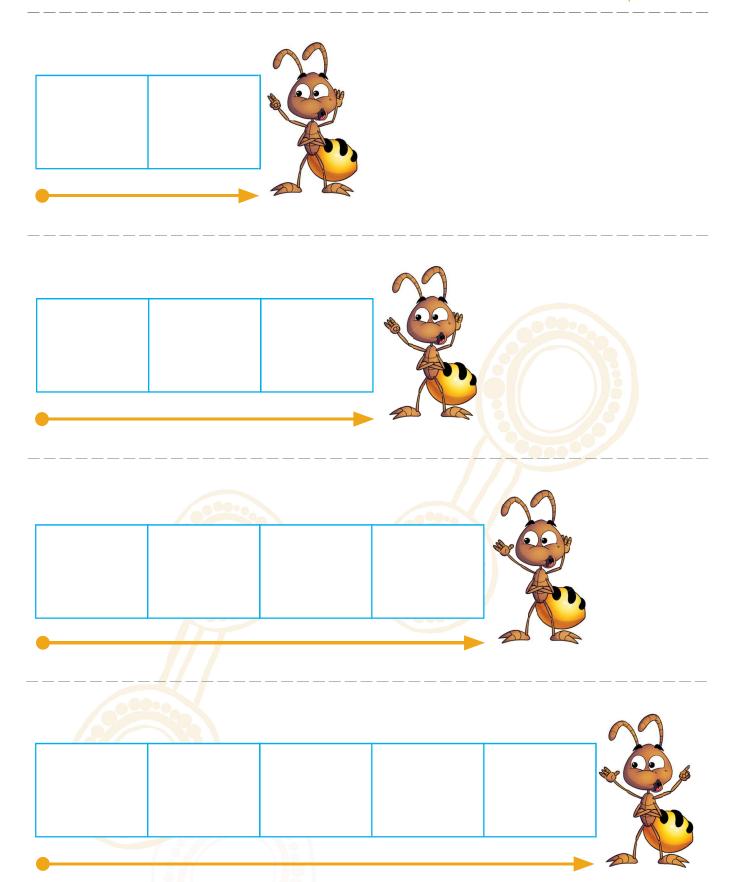

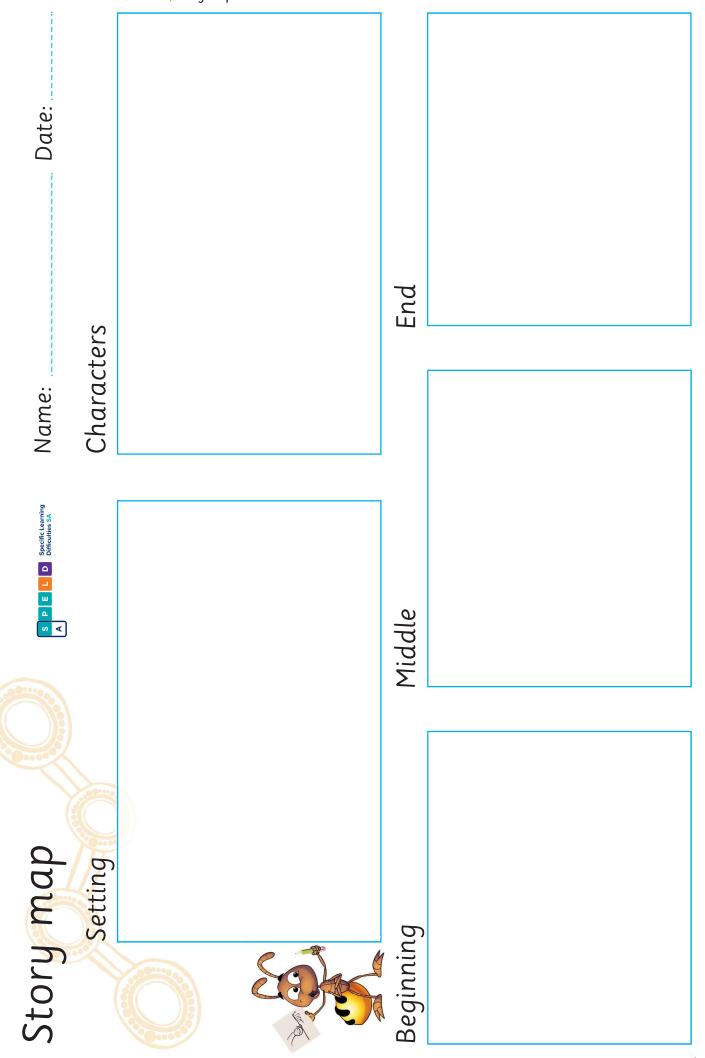

Roll and reflect



Instructions: This activity is best done after several reads of the same book. In an adult-led small group, students take turns rolling a die and respond to the question for the number rolled. The adult will need to read the questions for the students. If students have difficulty responding, prompt or refer back to the book and model aloud the thinking of coming to an answer. Gradually release the support given as students become more familiar with the activity and responses are repeated.
