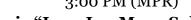

#### **COVID UPDATE**

This past week we had 4 active cases of COVID. Hawaii Department of Health has advised that we continue masking. Once we have no new cases for 5 consecutive days, mandatory masking will change to option. In the meantime, thank you for your continued compliance with DOH. All other activities are in full swing.

#### SEASON'S ALOHA FROM THE UTILITIES CONSERVATION COMMITTEE

"What is the Utilities Conservation Committee (UCC) and what does it do?"

One Kalakaua (1K) commissioned Hawaii Energy Systems (HES) to do an ASHRAE Level 2 Energy Audit to identify potential energy conservation measures which was completed in March 2023. The UCC was established as an advisory committee to the One Kalakaua Board of Directors (1KBOD) to prioritize the findings in the report and to present those findings to the Board.

The Audit found that 1K could save 96,283 kWh, or approximately \$39,876 in electricity costs each year, or \$3,323 per month. To effect this positive change, the UCC has been working with Jan April and has drawn up a list of ten priorities based on the report. The UCC Chair also presented data to the 1KBOD at its November 10, 2023, meeting.

Of the ten priorities, Priority 3: HOKA LED Lighting and Priority 6: Pool Spa Transformer were January 2024. Priority 5: Dining Room Exterior Door Weather Strip has been partially completed as the private dining room still needs done. The other eight priorities are in process.

The UCC feels that Priority 4: Beauty Shop Lighting has gone beyond the preview of the committee as 1K is now trying to find an architect not a contractor for the job.

1K has gotten two contractor bids for Priority 1: Sub-metering Cost Benefit Study and is waiting for a third to adhere to the procurement process. Additionally, two estimates have been obtained for Priority 8: Kitchen Rangehood Replacement which will be used to generate an RFP.

There has been a lot of discussion on Priority 2: Replace Thermostats in Common Areas. As of now, the 1K Administration has stated that all public area thermostats have been set at 72 degrees but is still in the process of identifying contractors. The new door is on Oahu to complete Priority 7: Freezer Door Replacement. However, 1K needs to rent a refrigerated truck as well as schedule the installation with a contractor.

A meeting with Steve Norstrom was held on November 1, 2023, via Zoom and a pamphlet was distributed to residents to meet Priority 9: Board of Water Supply Audit. Additionally, the UCC is hoping to schedule Priority 10: HECO Energy Conservation Presentation in March.

So, you can see that the UCC has been busy. Help the UCC make 2024 a banner year for utility conservation at 1K. We want your input on further projects and ideas of how 1K can utilize its utilities more efficiently. Our meetings are the first Wednesday of every month or more frequently if necessary. Please stop by and give your input, it will be appreciated.

# **Resident Survey Responses**

The Resident Survey was sent out in section of topics. One of the sections focused on the Lobby.

**What's working**: Many of the resident spoke of being happy with the cleanliness, and decorations. Feedback stated its welcoming and festive. Residents were happy that the puzzle table and the daily newspaper being put out are back.

How can we improve?: One suggestion pointed out is that the thermostats are set to 68 degrees in the lobby and dinning room. Thank you for the feedback. This has been addressed and all thermostats in the common areas have been moved up to a set point of 73 degrees.

If you can play piano or know of anyone who would like to play in the lobby, please let Linda know and we can place the performance on the calendar for all to enjoy. We are actively looking for both pianist and harpist for resident's enjoyments. There is a practice piano in the lobby of B2 and it is available for both to residents and their guests as well.

If you have activities that you would like added to the lobby such as specific games, decorations or open activities, please let us know. We will do our best to accommodate. Our lobby is a special hub for casual encounters, merriment and mingling. The more opportunities we can create to build community, the better.

# **ROSES FROM AARP & WISH OF A LIFETIME**

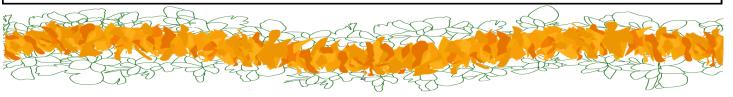
