#### **NEW BUSINESS**

- Minutes of Operations Committee Meeting on May 5, 2025 There being no objections, Chair Williams announced that the minutes of the May 5, 2025 Operations Committee Meeting were approved as circulated.
- 2. **Resident Handbook and House Rules Input from Owners and Residents** Chair Williams opened the floor for input from the owners and residents regarding the Resident Handbook and House Rules (RHHR).
  - a. Owner Julian Ako request there be changes made to the current Pet policy to include pets in addition to service animals and emotion support animals.
  - b. Owner Arlene Lee-Williams & Owner Jackie Tokunaga request changes that had already been included in the proposed Resident Handbook and House Rules on behalf of the Food Committee.
- 3. **Resident Handbook and House Rules** Liaison Ijacic provided an overview of the Resident Handbook and House Rules by key topics.
  - a. Key topics from the prior year's RHHR include:
    - i. Separate the Forms & Acknowledgement of policies from the RHHR.
    - ii. Changing the cost for the Declaration, Bylaws and RHHR from \$25 to no charge due to the State Law change.
    - iii. Discontinue OKEAF and set up an Employee Holiday Bonus to which funds are set aside annually from the maintenance fee and club dues.
    - iv. Increase in the Fees and Rates in the last section of the RHHR.
    - v. Simplification of Dress Code.
    - vi. Increase in coverage limits for homeowners' insurance policy.
- 4. Other Concerns of Committee Members None at this time.


