













## CROCHETED WRAP

This colorful and squishy wrap can be customized to be longer and thinner or shorter and wider. Leave ends long if you want to make them into fringe

### THE DETAILS

#### THE MEASUREMENTS

17 1/4" wide x 62 1/2" long

#### **SUPPLIES**

Yarn:

Superfine 400 multi pack braid shown in color Peacock
50 q /200 yards each of 5 colors:

A – 3032 Magenta

B - 3088 Coral

C - 3020 Cobalt Blue

D – 3048 Tropical Ocean

E-3094 Emerald

#### Hook:

Crochet hook sized to get gauge.

#### GAUGE

3 1/2 sts and 2 1/2 rows= 1" in pattern stitch, blocked.

### Suggested hook size:

US F/5 (3.75 mm)

#### How to check your gauge:

With size US F (3.75 mm) hook, ch 18. Work in dc spike stitch until you have a square; measure how many sts fit across 4" then divide by 4; this is your stitches per inch. If you have more than 3 1/2 sts per inch, your crocheting is too tight; unravel and try another swatch on a bigger hook. If you have fewer than 31/2 sts per inch, your crocheting is too loose, try again with a smaller hook. If you want to be daring, you can start crocheting and skip checking your gauge – your wrap will still fit.

### DC SPIKE STITCH PATTERN

Chain a multiple of 4 plus 2.

**Set up row:** Ch 3 (counts as dc), dc, \*ch1, skip 1 stitch, 3 dc; rep from \*, ch1, skip 1 st, 2 dc.

Row 1: Ch 3 (counts as dc), dc, ldc into stitch 2 rows below, dc, \*ch 1, skip 1 stitch, dc, ldc into st 2 rows below, dc; rep from \*, dc.

Row 2: Ch 3 (counts as dc), dc, \*ch 1 skip 1 stitch, dc, ldc into st 2 rows below, dc; rep from \*, ch 1 skip 1 stitch, 2 dc.

Rep rows 1 and 2 for DC spike stitch pattern.

### STRIPE PATTERN

With A work 1 row of dc spike stitch.
With B work 1 row of dc spike stitch.
With C work 1 row of dc spike stitch.
With A work 1 row of dc spike stitch.
With D work 1 row of dc spike stitch.
With C work 1 row of dc spike stitch.
With E work 1 row of dc spike stitch.
With D work 1 row of dc spike stitch.
With B work 1 row of dc spike stitch.
With B work 1 row of dc spike stitch.
With E work 1 row of dc spike stitch.

How to deal with the ends: You can carry the unused colors along the side of your work for stripes that are 3 rows apart (your yarn will be on the side you need it on) and sc over them at the end OR you can cut the ends the right length for fringe, OR you can work the ends in as you go.





### STITCHES AND ABBREVIATIONS

ch (chain): Wrap the yarn around the crochet hook (yarn over) and draw it through the loop on the hook to form the first chain. Rep this step as many times as instructed. (The loop on the hook is never included when counting the number of chains).

dc (double crochet): Yarn over hook, insert hook into indicated st, yarn over and pull up a loop; [yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook] twice.

Idc (long double crochet): Yarn over hook, insert hook into indicated st 2 rows below, yarn over and pull up a long loop to bring stitch the same height as neighboring dcs; [yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook] twice.

rep: repeat

**sc:** (single crochet): Insert crochet hook in indicated stitch, yarn over and pull up a loop; yarn over and draw through both loops on hook.

# HOW TO CROCHET IT

With A, chain 222.

Row 1: Skip 1 ch and sc across to end – 221 scs.

Beginning with A, changing yarns every row according to the stripe pattern, work the dc spike stitch pattern for 39 rows.

Last row: Keeping in stripe pattern, ch<sub>3</sub>, dc, ldc, \*<sub>3</sub> dc, ldc, rep from \*; 2 dc.

### FINISHING

Weave in ends. Block.

#### **Customize Your Wrap**

Use your leftover yarn to add to your ends and knot to make fringe. Or if you carried your yarns up the side, single crochet across the two ends. Add some extra rows to the ends in different colors.
