The Master License is the highest level which can be obtained and allows you to perform the duties of an OUPV/ Six-pack Captain and also operate Inspected Vessels.






Inspected Vessels are approved to carry seven or more paying passengers and have been built in accordance with rigid USCG standards.



A Master license is issued for operation on the Great Lakes, Inland and Near Coastal waterways...





...and comes in three versions: 25; 50; or a 100 Ton License.

Both the amount of sea service time and the size vessels you have been on will influence the license you are eligible for.












Ferry Boats, harbor tour boats, sailing schooners, dive boats and whale watching boats are all examples of inspected vessels.










You must be at least 19 years old.





US Citizenship is required.

You must have a minimum of 360 days of boating experience. 90 of those days must have occurred in the last three years. The Coast Guard calls this recency.
