The Master License is the highest level which can be obtained and allows you to perform the duties of an OUPV/Six-Pack Captain and also operate Inspected Vessels.


Inspected Vessels are approved to carry seven or more paying passengers and have been built in accordance with rigid USCG standards.

A Master License is issued operation on the Great Lakes, Inland and Near Coastal waterways.

A Master License comes in three versions: 25, 50 or a 100 Ton License.


## 100 TON



Both the amount of sea service time and the size vessels you have been on will influence the license you are eligible for.

## THE FOLLOWING ARE EXAMPLES OF INSPECTED VESSELS:



Although the necessary boating experience required for each version of Master License varies, the basic minimum requirements include:

You must be at least 19 years old.

US Citizenship is required.

You must have a minimum of 360 days of boating experience. 90 of those days must have occurred in the last three years. The Coast Guard calls this recency.

Pass a physical and drug test.

Hold a valid adult CPR and Basic First Aid Card.

Obtain a Transportation Workers Identification Credential (TWIC card) this is a background check done by Homeland Security.

And completion of the Mariners Learning System USCG approved 25/50 or 100 Ton Master course.
