

The Master License is the highest level which can be obtained and allows you to perform the duties of an OUPV/Six-pack Captain and also operate Inspected Vessels.



Ferry Boats, harbor tour boats, sailing schooners, and whale watching boats are all examples of inspected vessels.



A Master license is issued for operation on the

LICENSE Although the necessary boating experience required for each version of Master license varies the basic minimum requirements include:





You must be at least 19 years old.

U.S. Citizenship is required.





Have a minimum of 360 days boating experience. 90 of those days must have occurred in the last three years. The Coast Guard calls this recency.

90 DAYS in LAST 3 YEARS

Pass a Physical and Drug Test.





Hold a valid adult CPR

Obtain Workers a Transportation Identification Credential (TWIC card) this is a background check done by Homeland Security.





And completion of the Mariners Learning System Coast Guard approved 25/50 or 100 Ton Master course.

The Mariners Learning System suite of Coast Guard approved courses offer an alternative to the regular testing process held at the USCG Regional Exam Centers.
