

THERE ARE TWO OPTIONS WHEN ORDERING AN OMBRÉ RUG FOR STAIRS:

OPTION 1 - The Ombré design runs horizontally (parallel to the risers)
OPTION 2 - The Ombré design runs vertically (perpendicular to the risers)

Construction & Content Options: We can make rugs for stairs in a wool flatweave, like our Khablay, or in a 100-knot wool. We do not recommend 100% silk for stairs due to slipping and safety issues. We can, however, tweed the silk with wool or mohair.


Ombré design is always woven parallel to the width.

OPTION 1: Horizontal

WIDTH: The Ombré design is always woven parallel to the width. The weave direction in this option is parallel to the Ombré and the riser. The most economical option is for the mill to make the stair runner with a finished edge.

LENGTH: The installer should provide lengths that take into account any overage needed for installation.

LANDING PIECES: RHI recommends that landing pieces be made in a solid color to ensure that the piece connects to the runners seamlessly. Please note, landing pieces will be parallel to the stairs in one direction only, if there is a turn.





- * The installer is responsible for measuring the stairs and confirming all dimensions. They are also responsible for the rug pad, latex & scrim, and the installation. The installer should bill the client directly. For complicated projects, RHI is happy to speak with the installer directly to sort out any potential issues prior to ordering.
- * Please note: As with all hand-made rugs, there is a possibility of variance in dimensions—this variance is typically 1"-2". If precision is critical, the installer should add overage to the width and then cut down the rug on site to ensure precise measurement—this decision is up to the designer.



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OPTION 2 - The Ombré design runs vertically (perpendicular to the risers)

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
Ombré design is always woven parallel to the width.

OPTION 2: Vertical

WIDTH: The Ombré design is always woven parallel to the width. The weave direction in this option is perpendicular to the riser. When specifying, refer to the length as the width. The max width for this mill is 24'. Any runner longer than 24' will need to be made in 2 pieces—the installer should confirm what will work best. The most economical option is for the mill to make the stair runner with a finished edge.

LENGTH: The installer should provide lengths that take into account any overage needed for installation.

LANDING PIECES: Assuming there is a turn in the landing, the corners will be mitered. All widths will need to be the same to ensure seamless mitering.





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
