Join us for an intimate photographic journey and conversation between Dr. Carla Garapedian of the Armenian Film Foundation and renowned photographer Hrair Hawk Khatcherian on his travels to four major Armenian landmarks: the mountainous region of Artsakh, the Holy Bethlehem Church of New Julfa in Isfahan, Iran, the Armenian cemetery in Julfa in the Nakhchivan exclave of Azerbaijan, and the Armenian community in Romania.

His work was also included in the Metropolitan Museum of Art's Armenia! exhibition and book publication among many others.
