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
## RAW APPEAL

If you're in Milan, make a beeline for interiors treasure trove Raw, which has two outposts: one on Corso Magenta and one on Via Palermo. Both stock a mix of antiques sourced from French flea markets and contemporary objects by the likes of John Derian. The shops are owned by interior designer Paolo Badesco (see inside his Parisian apartment on p150). 'We try to be different in the way we tell our story,' says Badesco, who changes the look of both venues several times a year (rawmilano.it).









## MODERN EGYPTOLOGY

Jam Space is a new addition to the Chelsea shopping scene, specialising in furniture, homeware, art and design objects from Egypt and the Middle East. The store was opened by Egyptian Hedayat Islam, who also co-founded Cairo-based interior design and architecture company Eklego Design. Stand-out pieces include an 'Ornamatics' chair by Encode Collaborative – mathematicians and architects who create reimagined versions of traditional Islamic patterns – handmade coloured glass and the 'Arabesque' table (pictured), which is based on geometric Egyptian prints (jamspace.uk).
