Deception, Indenture and Secrets at the \$12 Billion Milton Hershey School

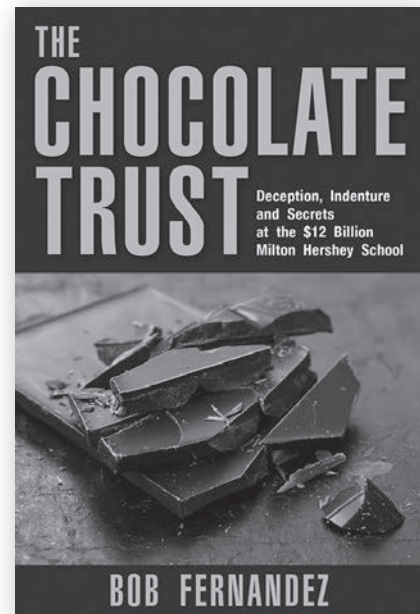

In the early 1900s, chocolate tycoon Milton Hershey founded the Hershey School for fatherless poor boys, with the intention of instilling them with Christian values, a hard work ethic, and the promise of a better future. But all was not what it seemed.

The Chocolate Trust tells a different story about the school—a story of pupils who worked as indentured laborers for the Hershey Company; a Trust that has raked in billions in endowments, though the money is diverted from the children and put into Hersheypark, and a new golf course; and the recent history of the school, and a decade that has seen many academic disappointments. Through shrewd reporting and firsthand accounts, Bob Fernandez's riveting book makes it clear that the legacy of the Hershey School has made Hershey, Pennsylvania far from "the sweetest place on earth."

Bob Fernandez is a staff writer for *The Philadelphia Inquirer*, currently covering the telecommunications industry. He has won multiple journalism awards since his career began in 1987, including for his stories on the Hershey Trust, which he has covered since 2001.

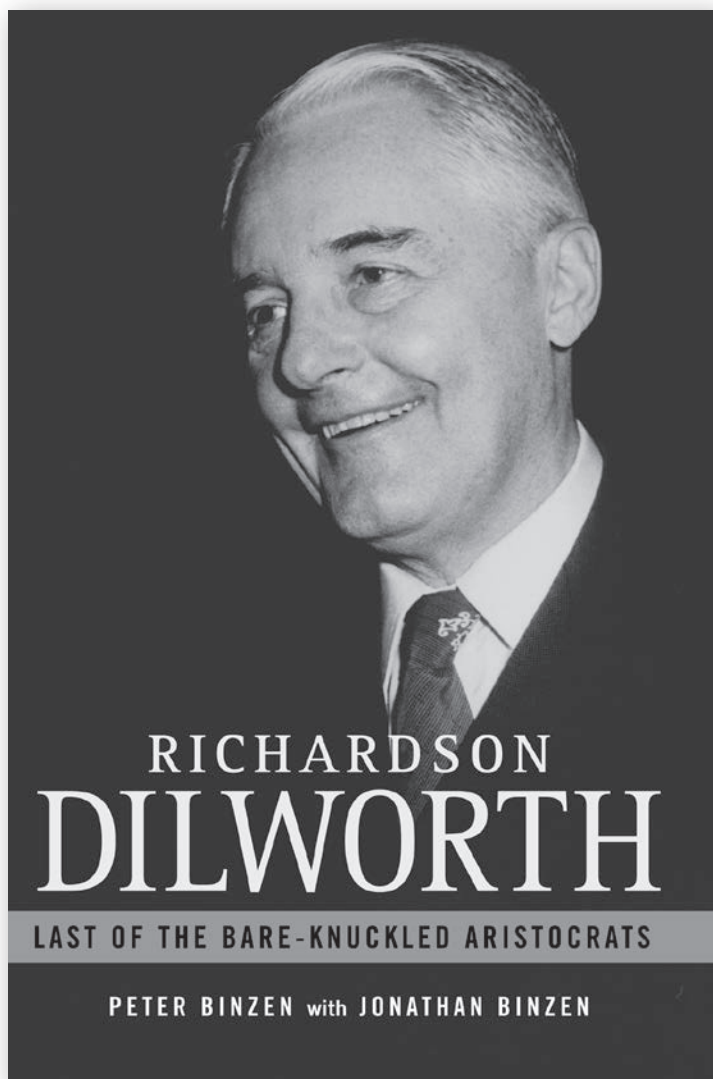
Richardson Dilworth

This is the first complete biography of Philadelphia's great political reformer, Richardson Dilworth (1898–1974). He was district attorney, school board president, and the 91st mayor of Philadelphia from 1956 to 1962. The book gives his family history, his youth in Pittsburgh and New York City, his service in both world wars, his education at Yale, and his involvement with Philadelphia figures including Joseph Clark, Moses and Walter Annenberg, Albert M. Greenfield, Thacher Longstreth, and Bill Green, as well as Joseph McCarthy and John F. Kennedy.

Richardson Dilworth emerges in this stirring biography as one of Philadelphia's great citizens, perhaps its greatest since Benjamin Franklin. He was a true inspiration to his adopted city, and since his death in 1974, Philadelphia has not seen his like. For those two reasons and for the multitude of contributions he made to the people of Philadelphia and their way of life, the mayor who was also a statesman will long be remembered.



Peter Binzen was a reporter, editor, and columnist for more than 30 years at the *Philadelphia Bulletin*, and for more than 20 years at *The Philadelphia Inquirer*. He is the author of *Whitetown USA*, the coauthor of *The Wreck of the Penn Central* and *The Cop Who Would Be King*, as well as the editor of *Nearly Everybody Read It*, a history of the *Philadelphia Bulletin*.

Jonathan Binzen is a writer, editor, and photographer. A senior editor at *Fine Woodworking* magazine, he has written and illustrated articles for *This Old House*, *American Craft*, *Inspired House*, and *Home Furniture*. He is the coauthor of *Arts and Crafts Furniture*, a history tracing the international scope of the Arts and Crafts movement.

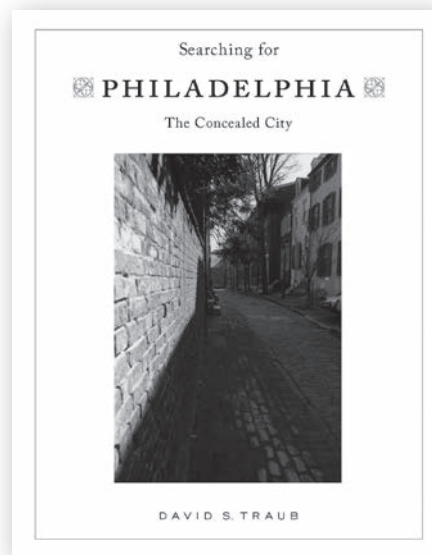
The Concealed City

Philadelphia: A Railroad History describes the remarkable development of the railroad industry in Philadelphia and the intense competition that pitted the Pennsylvania Railroad against the Reading Railroad, and those two titans against the formidable Baltimore and Ohio Railroad, to dominate the regional market. The book details the impact of the rail industry on four local firms—Baldwin Locomotive, the Cramp Shipyard, Midvale Steel and the Budd Company—and on the Philadelphia waterfront and its port. It concludes with speculation on the impact, challenges and opportunities presented by Conrail's acquisition by CSX and Norfolk Southern. *Philadelphia: A Railroad History* also highlights the key roles of the city's industrial giants during this colorful era, including Steven Girard, Matthias Baldwin, William Sellers, Franklin Gowen, John W. Garrett, George Roberts and Edward G. Budd.

Edward W. Duffy is a graduate of La Salle and Temple Universities. He has worked for Philadelphia's Department of Commerce, its Planning Commission, its Port Corporation, and the Philadelphia Industrial Development Corporation. Edward Duffy's interest in railroads dates from his role as liaison between the City of Philadelphia and various rail reorganization agencies in the early 1970s that resulted in the creation of Conrail in 1976.
