

Canadian Golf & Country Club's 2020-19 COVID-Tournament Policy Guidelines (V 07-30-07)

As most of Ontario moves into COVID Stage 3 from Stage 2 we have had numerous people reach out to us to see what can and cannot be done at the Canadian this year for golf tournaments.

The management team has had continuous conversations with our staff and tournament organizers and updated our policies as more information is acquired.

- The management of the Canadian has a moral and ethical obligation to keep our staff, their families and all of our customers as safe as possible during this COVID-19 pandemic.
- Under Stage 3 Ontario has mandated gatherings of no more than 100 people.
- Our position is if you are bringing an event to the Canadian it cannot exceed 100 people in total.
- Ontario and City of Ottawa have discussed possibly moving back to stage 2 if people continue to act in an irresponsible manner and do not social distance properly.
- Alcohol is usually involved in situations where people drop their guard and stop social distancing.

Based upon the points above the Canadian will allow Tournaments under the following conditions:

- The Canadian will host straight time events (consecutive tee times) of up to 96 people which will allow for four volunteers to a maximum of 100 people at the gathering.
- Any food service will be done via take out, i.e. box lunch or dinner, and or on course food stations that will not be conducive to people congregating before or after their round.
- For numerous reasons we will not be doing any indoor food service in the club house or on our patio.
- Tournament participants are asked to arrive no more than 45 minutes before their tee time.
- In the parking lot and area around the clubhouse it may be difficult to social distance properly so we ask tournament participants to respect their fellow golfers by wearing a mask, from the time they arrive in the parking lot until they arrive at the first tee. Please note this is Mandatory while in the clubhouse as per Ontario guidelines, (when seated outside, masks may be removed).
- Tournament participants have 45 minutes after coming off the golf course to vacate / leave the Canadian Golf club property.
- Tournament organizer or their delegate is responsible to ensuring all participants in their event vacate the property in the allotted time as per above.
- No loitering or tailgating in the parking lot will be permitted.
- As an additional safety protocol, no on-course food or sampling will be permitted by non CGCC staff / third party people.
- Tournament participants found bringing their own alcohol will be immediately asked to leave the property (we suggest you make this abundantly clear to your participants).



- While on the Canadian's property, provincial guidelines must be followed. Our staff will mandate all customers comply with the Canadian's and provincial guidelines. In the rare situation where customers do not adhere, they will be deemed hostile. The Canadian reserves the right to have any customer removed from our property who will not comply.
- We appreciate your business and respect your decision to host or not to host your event with us this year.
- The Canadian reserves the right to further tighten restrictions or cancel events should COVID-19 cases rise in the Ottawa area in the coming weeks or months or Ontario mandates the Ottawa area back into Stage 2.

I know that many people have different views on what should be allowed or how they view the entire COVID-19 pandemic. Make no mistake, Gail and I value your business and your partnership but, we must be vigilant during this difficult time for the safety of our staff, customers and their families.
