


Karida shows off the moth motif in our sample of the Winglet Mitts, knit in Bentalou.

Karida wears the Big Ease in Bromo. Our version is has a mockneck, but the pattern also has directions for a full turtleneck.

With two skeins of Studio Chunky yarn in each kit, you'll have enough to make multiple Flash Caps. Personalize them with stripes and zig-zags, or come up with your own designs using the pattern as a template.




Kerrin (left) is wearing the cowl version of the Duet in Woodberry. Cameron wears the scarf version in Charles Village.



The Scarf-Cowl Duet uses the same stitch pattern in both accessories, and was designed with the idea that you can knit any length you wanteither use up all 4 skeins for a full-length scarf, or stop a little early and seam the ends to create a cowl or neck-warmer.



This new tee design by Caitlin Hunter has delicate, wavy lace stripes reminiscent of sun breaking through cracks of ice. Glacial Light's short sleeves and cropped length are perfect for layering under a flannel or jacket, and worn with your favorite jeans or skirt.
