Pelargoniums

The species Pelargonium is a half hardy shrub first collected in South Africa and brought to Britain in the mid seventeenth century by sailing ships from the Dutch East Indies Company.

Most Pelargoniums like a sunny aspect and can be grown in pots, hanging baskets, window boxes and open ground. In the right compost and fed with a high potash feed they will flower from spring right through to late autumn. Protected from frost they will continue to thrive for many years.

Nomenclature: The Botanical name of the plants featured in this section is Pelargonium. We do not use the name Geranium at all, although they are often incorrectly referred to as this. The name Geranium rightfully belongs to a group of hardy herbaceous plants native to Great Britain, Northern Europe and North America.

STELLAR PELARGONIUM



'Tom Kirkland' Having helped to raise funds for the PAGS, this gorgeous new Stellar raised by Steve Pollard has been named after Tom Kirkland. Double, almost fluorescent, magenta pink flowers on well zoned dark green foliage. Free flowering, bushy and compact.

REGAL PELARGONIUM



'Imperial Bute' We have hoped for years to get a new addition to the Bute family, so it was a well timed arrival, that Imperial Bute burst into our lives. A vibrant and robust new version of this classic Regal, Imperial Bute has the same single, almost black flowers but with a striking, lilac & purple edge to the petals.

REGAL PELARGONIUMS

These are some of the most colourful of all the Pelargonium groups traditionally used as pot plants for the house and greenhouse/conservatory. They are outstanding when used in containers in the garden but just ensure rigorous dead-heading and copious amounts of potash feed. They will flower the whole season long.

'Cascade Lilac' The Cacade varieties are used prolifically on the continent for their balcony displays. Short jointed and single flowered



'Cascade Pink' As with Cascade Lilac, but this is a great trailing variety that mixes well with any colour pallette



'Cascade Red' An exceptional cultivar with scarlet flowers in abundance



'Choun Cho' (S) unusual shade of purple maroon (V)



'Colonel Baden Powell' (SD) blush pink, feathered mauroon (V)



'Crocodile' (S) with deep rose pink flowers and mesh variegation on the leaves (B)



'Fairlee' (S) lilac, feathered purple. Neat and compact habit (C)



'Giroflee' A vigorous Ivy Leaf with almost luminous, cerise-pink, rosebud type flowers.



'Harvard' (SD) large rich red flowers. Vigorous habit (V)

ROSEBUD PELARGONIUMS

Most of these varieties date back to Victorian times with the open flower pip furled as tight as a rosebud which gives them their name. This makes plants grown as a specimen very handsome and will grow happily in the sunniest of positions.

On receipt, if substitute of our choice is unacceptable, you are entitled to return it within 7 days and we will reimburse the cost of the plant and postage. The fact that we accept an order does not guarantee that every plant will be available at the time of execution; occasionally plants may die or be damaged by adverse conditions. We would, of course, then refund any payments already made.

DISPATCH: You are entitled to cancel your order from the day of ordering until the week before dispatch. However, because of the nature of the goods, once we have dispatched your plants, under section 13, paragraph 1c of the Consumer Protection (Distance Selling) regulation 2000, goods that are made to the consumer specification or are liable to deteriorate or expire rapidly means your statutory 7 working days cooling off period is void. Before dispatch, plants are examined and packed with great care to ensure that they arrive in perfect condition. If your plants


are not in good condition upon receipt because of damage or delay, notify us immediately by telephone, email or letter, giving date of arrival and condition of the plants. This matter will then be dealt with as swiftly as possible. Once the plants have been delivered safely the ownership has passed from us to the customer. We cannot be responsible for the health of plants when they are grown in conditions not under our control, although we are quite prepared to give advice on growing problems.

PAYMENT: By credit card, cheque or postal order. Credit card payment will be taken from your account at the point of dispatch. Cheques (made payable to **Fibrex Nurseries Ltd**.) and postal orders will be banked on receipt of order. However, we may not be able to dispatch within the statutory 30 days due to planting/growing conditions or circumstances over which we have no control, so if payment is made by cheque or postal order you are accepting that we will not return your moneys after 30 days. PELARGONIUM ORDERS: All plants are pot grown and dispatched by either letter post for small orders or overnight courier with tracking for orders of 6 plants and over, because speed is essential once the Pelargoniums are packed. Plants sent out for mail orders are grown in biodegradeable pots. On receipt of plants, pot on into larger pots leaving the bio-degradeable pot on the plant - the roots will grow through this and eventually the pot will disintegrate. John Innes No 2, or a good quality fresh multi-purpose compost can be used. They can also be planted straight out into the garden or into tubs still with the biodegradeable pot on (remembering that they will not withstand frost). If you are growing plants in pots water sparingly, then after four weeks, water with a high potash feed (tomato feed) once every 7 days during the late Spring and Summer.
