

RING SIZE GUIDE

There are two ways one can measure the ring size, and they are as follows:

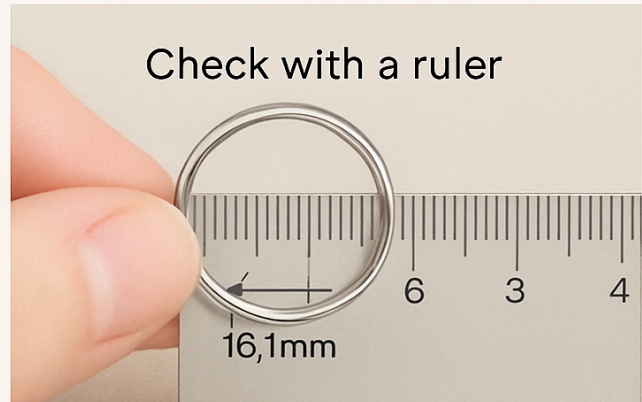
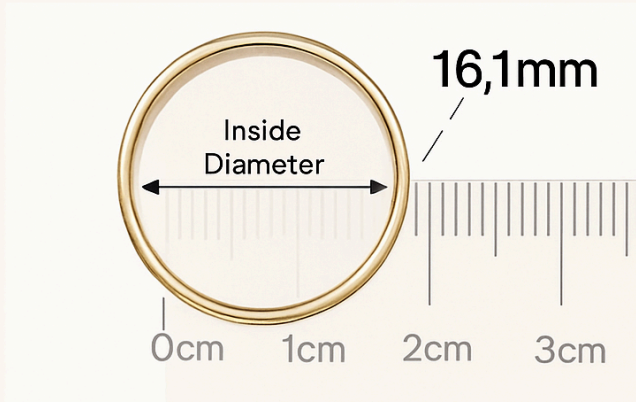
- 1) Measure the ring size from an existing ring method.
- 2) String or paper string method.

1) EXISTING RING METHOD

This method is best when you already have a ring that fits perfectly. The steps to measure the existing ring are as follows:

1. Choose The Right Ring: Select a ring that fits the intended finger comfortably (ensure it's not too tight or too loose).
2. Measure The Inner Diameter:
 - a. Place the ring on a ruler or measuring tape.
 - b. Measure the inside diameter (straight across the center of the ring from edge to edge in millimeters) as shown below.
 - c. Avoid measuring the outer edges.

Find Your Ring Size



Option 1: Use Your Existing Ring

Just get a ring that fits comfortably on the intended finger. Place it flat against a ruler and measure the inner diameter in millimeters.

Option 2: Send Us a Picture

Alternatively, place your ring on a ruler as shown and send us a picture. We'll help you find your accurate size.

3. Use a Ring Size Chart:

Compare the diameter you measured to a standard ring size chart to find your US ring size. For example, for a diameter of 16.1 mm, the ring size will be 5.5

Ring Size Chart

US Ring Size	Inside Diameter (mm)	Inside Circumference (mm)
4	14.8	46.5
4.5	15.2	47.8
5	15.7	49.3
5.5	16.1	50.6
6	16.5	51.9
6.5	16.9	53.1
7	17.3	54.4
7.5	17.7	55.7
8	18.2	57.2
8.5	18.5	58.3
9	18.9	59.5
9.5	19.3	60.8
10	19.8	62.2

Please compare the diameter and the circumference of the ring with the ring size column to find out the ring size.

2) STRING OR PAPER METHOD

This is best for a quick, at-home method using a string or paper strip. The steps are as follows:

1. Cut a String or Strip of Paper:

Cut a thin strip (not more than 1 cm wide) or use a non-stretchy string.

2. Wrap Around Your Finger:

a. Wrap it snugly around the base of the finger where the ring will be worn.

b. Make sure it's not too tight; you want the ring to slide over your knuckle comfortably.

3. Mark the Spot:

Use a pen to mark the point where the string/paper overlaps.

4. Measure the Length:

a. Lay it flat and measure the marked length in millimeters

b. This is the circumference of your finger.

5. Convert to Ring Size:

Use a ring size conversion chart to find your US size based on circumference. For example: Circumference of 50.6 mm = US Size 5.5
