INTRO. TO PAINTING IN OIL & ACRYLIC: NIGHTS with Laura Harrison

6 WEEKS, THURSDAYS, APRIL 25 – MAY 30, 6:30 – 9:30 PM, \$180 + HST

This course is designed for those who are new to the medium of painting and those returning to painting but looking to refresh the basics and work on essential skills. This course will cover subjects like basic material knowledge, paint handling, composition and colour theory while working on specific exercises to demonstrate these skills. Students will learn how to make a painting from start to finish, working on personal projects of their choice with individual instruction and encouragement. Only the basic materials will be required for the first class. Students will get a chance to try both oil and acrylic if they are undecided about what to start with, or bring any materials they already have if they would like to ask questions.

MATERIALS: Gamblin Cold Wax Medium, oil paints (variety of colours –try to include some transparent ones), palette knives (at least one but feel free to try different shapes and sizes), rigid surfaces such as cradled panel or masonite (with 2-3 coats of gesso) 8x10 to 30x30, Arches Oil Paper (1-2 full sheets or a pad), Creative Catalyst Wedge (straight edge), masking tape, rolls of paper towel, Pan Pastel (choose a favourite colour), odourless mineral spirits (Gamblin is the "cleanest" - No Taltine Please) lidded jar for your OMS, metal tipped squirt bottle, Speedy Carve Block (any size – don't be afraid to go big!) palette for mixing paint

to MAN

PAINTING: INSPIRED BY THE MASTERS

with Sonal Raje

6 WKS, TUESDAYS, APR. 23 – MAY 28, 6:30 – 9:30 PM, \$180 + HST

This course is a six-week study of the works of significant figures that made a dent in the art world. Suited for beginners and seasoned artists, the course takes participants on a journey through the late nineteenth to mid twentieth century. Swirl your paintbrush around the stars that lit up Van Gogh's night skies, revel in the dots of Seurat's Pointillism technique, create collages like Picasso, explore bold colour cut-outs with Matisse, revel in the Klimt's gold mosaics and transform swaths of paint into flowers with Georgia O'Keefe. CHARCOAL REDUCTION DRAWING WORKSHOP

This workshop provides a complete overview of how to complete a reduction drawing using charcoal. Whether beginner or advanced, this method often results in captivating drawings that emphasize drama as well as composition. This method is also useful in rendering realistic glass with reflections as well as fabric and folds. We will be working from one still life for the entire class. The first portion of the class will focus on rendering the still life using contour line and the second part will be completing the values using the reduction method. This can be messy so please bring an apron or smock or wear suitable clothing. This workshop is suitable for both teens and adults.

MATERIALS: 2 sticks of compressed charcoal (not General's brand), kneadable eraser, vinyl eraser, 1 sheet (20X30) stonehenge white

Pencils and newsprint will be provided.

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POURING TECHNIQUES WITH FLUID ACRYLICS, MEDIUMS & RESIN

with Sonal Raje 2 DAYS, SATURDAY & SUNDAY, JULY 27 & 28, 10 AM – 4 PM, \$165 + HST

Learn 2 different techniques using pouring mediums, fluid acrylic paints, mixed media paints and resins to create dimensional artworks. On day one we will experiment with the "flip cup" method using acrylic medium and fluid acrylic paints. The second day we'll try our hand at using the Pebeo Fantasy, Moon, Prisme and Vitrail colours and pouring resin to create some unique and exciting effects.
