Grow your creativity by exploring unconventional drawing techniques and experimenting with unusual approaches. Students will be introduced to drawing with atypical tools and be shown unusual ways to use traditional media. Experiment with drawing using a sense of touch, movement, expression and put forth your inner vision in a unique way. All skill levels welcome.

Materials: Ink; Charcoal sticks; oil pastel; graphite stick; stainless steel palette knife; spray bottle; syringe; chalk stick; a few sheets of heavy paper (such as Mayfair, watercolour, or mixed media paper); cotton cloth; 2 sheets of Yupo Paper. Some extra materials will be provided.

BEGINNER DRAWING: DAYS

with Vita Keeling

6 WEEKS, WEDNESDAYS, JAN. 15 – FEB. 19, 1-4 PM, \$200 + HST

This beginner drawing course uses traditional and conceptual methods to teach observational and technical skills. Instruction will be supported by demonstrations and examples of tools including: tonal value, measurement and proportion, contour drawing, perspective and expressive mark-making. Discover your own strengths and preferences through hands-on studio work.

Materials: A range of drawing pencils (from HB to 6B); assorted charcoal sticks (willow or vine); kneadable eraser; white eraser; x-acto knife; ruler; bull dog clips; assorted conte sticks (1 each: black, white, sanguine); medium sized sketchbook (9x12 or larger) with 80lb drawing paper for dry and wet media; Newsprint pad 18"x24".

Students under 18 years of age will require parental or guardian consent.

DRAWING FOR BEGINNERS: EVENINGS with David Caesar

Learn how to draw stuff! This class will start with basic observation techniques and then move on to fundamental principles. We will draw objects in perspective, learn about light and shadow, and use various mark-making techniques to realistically render our subject matter. Personal guidance will be available throughout the course as we put our techniques into practice!

Materials: Graphite pencils (HB, 2B, 4B); kneadable eraser; white eraser; medium sized sketchbook (11x14 or larger); 12" metal ruler. Optional (not required for the first class): 18"x24" grey drawing paper; black and white conte; any other wet or dry medium of your choice.

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PORTRAIT DRAWING: EVENINGS

6 WEEKS, MONDAYS, MAR. 9 – APR. 20, 6:30-9:30 PM, \$215 + HST *no class APR. 13 (Easter Monday)

This course is great for teens and adults or anyone looking to build a portfolio. Learn the art and science of portraiture in this fun and challenging class. We will cover basic structure and proportions of the head using measuring techniques and make our portraits come alive with light, shadow and colour. We will work from life and from photos, until the last class where you will work from a live model to bring it all together.

Materials: sketchbook (11x14 or larger); 0.5 technical pencil or HB pencil and sharpener; kneadable eraser; white eraser; 12" stainless steel ruler.

WATERCOLOUR FOR BEGINNERS: EVENINGS @ NAC

with Joe Swanek

8 WEEKS, WEDNESDAYS, JAN. 8 – FEB. 26, 7 - 9:30 PM, \$285 + HST

This introduction to watercolour course is designed to provide a stable foundation on which to develop your own unique visual voice. Using only 3 primary colours, students will focus on colour mixing and value charts, before moving on to complete a series of still life studies using a "paint-by-numbers" method. This process will remove the need trial and error while still encouraging individual expression.

Materials: Winsor and Newton Artist Watercolour - Winsor (Phthalo) Blue Red Shade, Transparent Yellow, Permanent Rose; #8 round watercolour brush (good quality); folding palette; 140lb watercolour paper (Arches or similar quality) - 1 sheet to start; masonite 18" x 24".

OPEN STUDIO @ GSA with Janice Mason Steeves

7 WEEKS, THURSDAYS, JAN. 9 - FEB. 20, 9:30 AM - 12:30 PM, \$245 + HST

OPEN STUDIO @ NAC with Eileen MacArthur

7 WEEKS, TUESDAYS, MAR. 3 – APR. 21, 10 AM – 1 PM, \$250 + HST *no class MAR. 17 (March Break)

This course is designed for all skill levels, combining instruction, critique and independent projects. Each class will begin with a brief warm-up exercise. You will have the opportunity to develop new work and/or revisit previous work that may be unresolved. Students are encouraged to be self-directed and will be taught the skills necessary to critique their own work and the work of others. Play and experimentation is supported using various tools, mediums, materials and ideas.

Materials: Bring your own preferred materials, substrates and reference materials. (Additional supplies may be recommended on an individual basis.) Easels and drawing boards will be provided.

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INTRODUCTION TO PAINTING: DAYS with Eileen MacArthur

6 WEEKS, TUESDAYS, JAN. 14 - FEB. 18, 10 AM - 1 PM, \$200 + HST

This course is ideal for those who have never painted before, those returning to painting and those looking to hone their basic skills. We will work on paint handling techniques, colour theory, composition, perspective and more. Individual instruction will be provided to build on new and existing knowledge.

Materials: sketchbook or canvas pad (8x10" or larger); palette paper pad; brown pastel pencil; container with lid for water or solvent; rags, #4 & #8 synthetic filbert brushes; acrylic or oil paint in the following colours: Cadmium Red Medium, Cadmium Yellow Medium, Ultramarine Blue, Cobalt Blue, Titanium White, Burnt Umber. For acrylic painters - optional slow-drying medium. For oil painters - please bring an odourless solvent such as Gamsol, citrus thinner, or taltine. NO HARSH SOLVENTS IN THE STUDIO PLEASE.

INTRODUCTION TO PAINTING: EVENINGS with Pearl Van Geest

7 WEEKS, THURSDAYS, MAR. 5 – APR. 16, 6:30 – 9:30 PM, \$230 + HST

This course is designed for students new to painting, or with experience but looking to refresh the basics and work on essential skills. Topics will include composition, paint handling, and colour theory with specific exercises to demonstrate these skills. Students will be encouraged to bring in and work on their own ideas or projects with individual instruction and support.

<u>Basic Materials</u>: Sketchbook of choice (8x10 or larger); HB Pencil and eraser; one 9x12 or larger painting support of your choice; Paint Colours: Lemon Yellow, Crimson (or Primary magenta), Phthalo Blue (or Primary Cyan), Titanium White, Mars or Ivory Black. *Optional colours: Cadmium Red Medium or Light, Ultramarine Blue, Cadmium Yellow Medium, Burnt Umber. <u>Acrylic Materials</u>: 2-3 synthetic brushes (#4 round, #6 filbert or flat, ½-1"flat); rags; disposable palette paper or wax paper.

<u>Oil Materials</u>: 2-3 coarse bristle brushes (#4 round, #6 filbert or flat, ½-1"flat); rags; linseed oil; glass jar with lid; odourless solvent. Please bring an odourless solvent such as Gamsol, citrus thinner, or taltine. NO HARSH SOLVENTS IN THE STUDIO PLEASE.

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WATERCOLOUR PAINTING FOR BEGINNERS: DAYS

with Vita Keeling

7 WEEKS, TUESDAYS, MAR. 3 – APR. 21, 1:30 – 4:00 PM, \$230 + HST

This class is perfect for anyone wanting to try watercolour, but unsure of where to start! Each class will include step-by-step demonstrations in various techniques including: washes, wet-on-wet, glazing, scraping and lifting. You will also learn about materials, colour mixing, basic drawing and composition. Come explore the beauty of watercolours in a relaxed atmosphere!

Materials: Plastic palette with mixing area; Watercolour paint - Cadmium Yellow Light, Cadmium Red Medium, Phthalo Blue, Burnt Sienna, Ultramarine Blue (optional colours: Cobalt Blue, Yellow Ochre, Alizarin Crimson, Scarlet Lake, Hookers Green, Phthalo Green, Burnt Umber, Dioxazine Violet); Brushes (synthetic or natural hair) - 1" flat, #8 + #6 round, #2 Rigger; 1 sheet watercolour paper- Arches 140 Cold Press (will be cut down); masking tape; paper towel; B or HB pencil; white or kneadable eraser; 1 small bottle of masking fluid; a small sketchbook.

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ACRYLIC EXPLORATIONS: POUR YOUR HEART OUT

with Sonal Raje

4 WEEKS, THURSDAYS, JAN. 30 – FEB. 20, 1 - 4 PM, \$140 + HST

This course is great for anyone who wants to embrace the energy of fluid colour while learning to pour with planning and intention. Try different techniques such as straight pour, tree ring, swipe, plus variations and embellishments.

Materials: Fluid Acrylic Paints of your choice - 6 colours (small size), white and black (large size); Demco Pouring Medium - large size; gloves. Some other materials and/or tools will be provided.

ACRYLIC EXPLORATIONS: A TASTE OF ABSTRACTION

with Sonal Raje

6 WEEKS, THURSDAYS, FEB. 27 – APR. 9, 12:30 – 3:30 PM, \$200 + HST

This course is great for those who are curious about abstract painting, but don't know where to start as well as experienced painters looking to try something new. Throughout the course you will work in 3 different themes: non-objective, floral, and landscape - all using the basic principles of abstraction.

Materials: Acrylic paint - Cadmium Yellow, Cadmium Red, Cerulean Blue, Phthalo Blue, Burnt Sienna, Ivory Black, Titanium White; Brushes - Round #1, 4, 8, Flat #8, 14, 20; 1-80z container of acrylic matte medium; 1- palette or palette paper pad; sketchbook; pencils - 2B, 4B, 6B; 3 sheets 140lb watercolour paper; 3 stretched canvases 16"x20".

PORTRAIT PAINTING IN A DIGITAL AGE

with David Caesar

6 WEEKS, WEDNESDAYS, JAN. 22 – FEB. 26, 6:30 - 9:30 PM, \$200+ HST

Take a picture - it lasts longer! This course is perfect for when you can't get anyone to sit still long enough to paint a portrait. Students will learn the process of creating realistic portraits from photographs using acrylic painting techniques that adapt to the possibilities (and limitations) of photo references. They will take inspiration from historical and contemporary artists throughout the course and personal guidance will be available as students take on their own self-directed projects. An intermediate level of drawing experience is highly recommended.

Materials: 11x14" sketchbook (or good drawing paper), 0.5 technical pencil with 2H leads, 5H drawing pencil, Factis BM2 Eraser, 12" stainless steel ruler; one sheet graphite transfer paper; acrylic paint (recommended colours: Mars or Ivory Black, Magenta, Primary Yellow, Phthalocyanine Blue [green shade], Titanium White [large tube], other colours maybe recommended based on student's individual reference photos); 11x14" gessoed board or larger; stiff synthetic brushes (#4 filbert, 1" angle, 1 or 2 5/0 round brushes, and any other brushes in your collection); an old rag; container for water; Optional: 180 or 220 grit sandpaper.

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PRINTMAKING FOR TEENS!

with Abby Nowakowski

6 WEEKS, THURSDAYS, JAN. 16 – FEB. 20, 6 - 8 PM, \$240 + HST

In this introductory printmaking course young artists will get a chance to spend each week with different printmaking techniques and materials. Students will look at the history of printmaking, explore layering and get hands-on experience with mono-print, woodcut, linocut, screenprinting and experimental combinations of these methods.

Materials: Sketchbook of your choice; Opional: A piece of fabric or a t-shirt for screenprinting. <u>All other materials are included!</u>

INTAGLIO PRINTMAKING

with Abby Nowakowski

4 WEEKS, TUESDAYS, MAR. 17 – APR. 7, 6:30 – 9:30 PM, \$180 + HST

In this exciting new course students will learn the foundations of drypoint (aka "intaglio") to complete a small series of prints. It will begin with understanding and caring for materials, then move on to the basics of etching and printing intaglio plates. Great for first-time printers and artists looking to experiment with a new and versatile medium.
