FRIULVINI PROSECCO EXTRA DRY

Friulvini Prosecco Extra Dry is a light straw yellow colour with a delicate scent of apples and peaches. In the mouth, it is fresh and fruity with a perfect level of acidity to refresh the palate without dominating it. Serve it well chilled, it is a joy to drink either by itself or with food.

This Friulvini Extra Dry Prosecco, which confusingly means it's just off dry, was created especially for us by La Delizia. The Glera (Prosecco) grapes came into the winery at perfect ripeness and were fermented at 16°C to capture all of the fresh, fruity nuances of this terrific grape variety. The fermentation was done by the Charmat method in stainless steel tanks and this took around 40 days, creating a very fine bead and a very elegant Prosecco.

ABOUT THE GROWER

Established in 1931 as Cantina Sociale Cooperativa Destra Tagliamento, the company now known as Viticoltori Friulani La Delizia is the largest wine-making facility of the Friuli Venezia Giulia region. La Delizia works with over 500 wine growers and their 2000 hectares of vineyards extending across the renowned Friuli Grave and Prosecco appellations. These historic vineyards and winemaking areas produce wines with a strong regional identities and characters that are enjoyed around the world.

Aside from producing highly enjoyable wines, in collaboration with leading research institutes and centres La Delizia cultivates over 100 hectares of vineyards planted with indigenous grape varieties of Friuli, aiming to build upon and improve the region's rich wine heritage.
