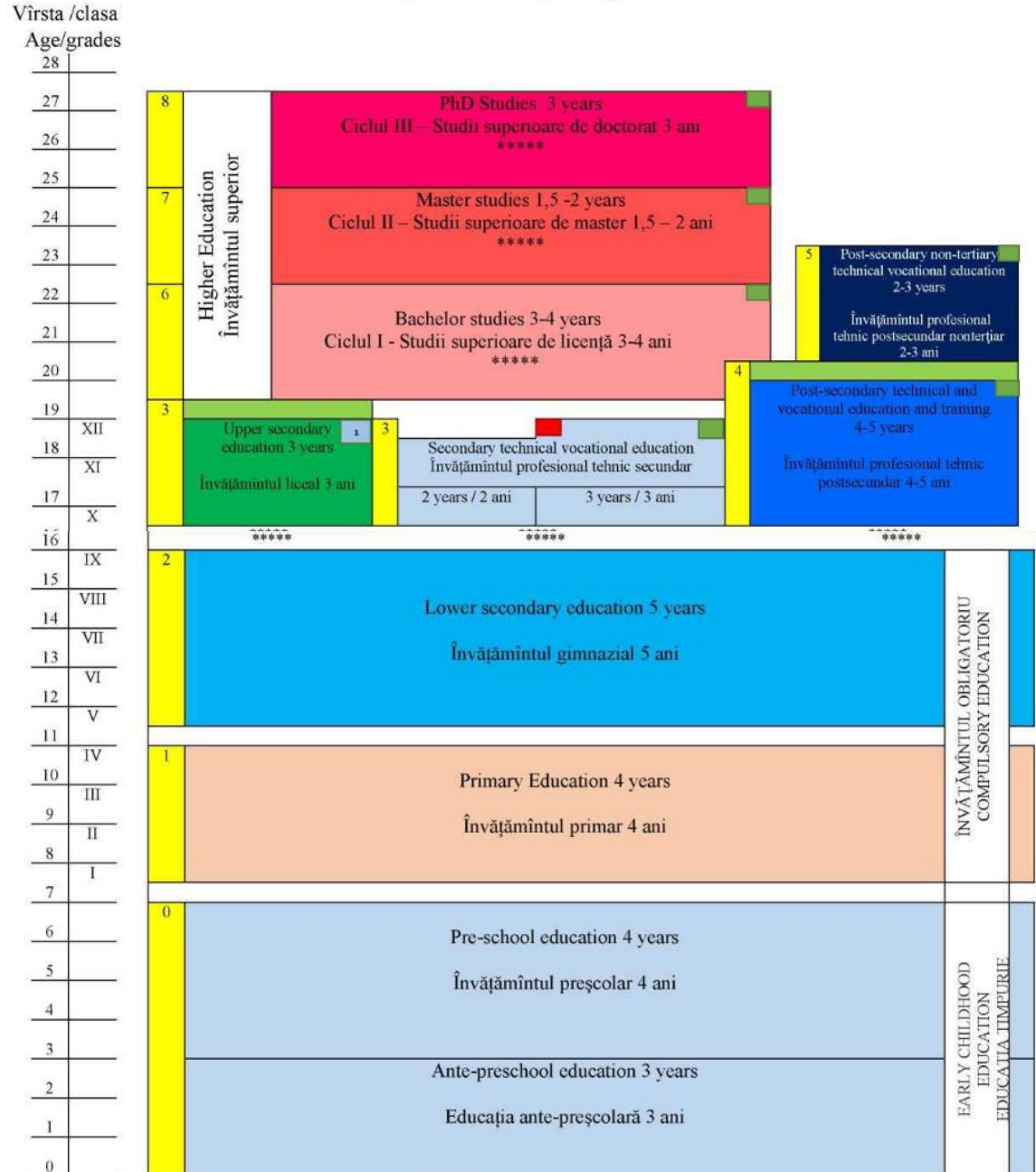

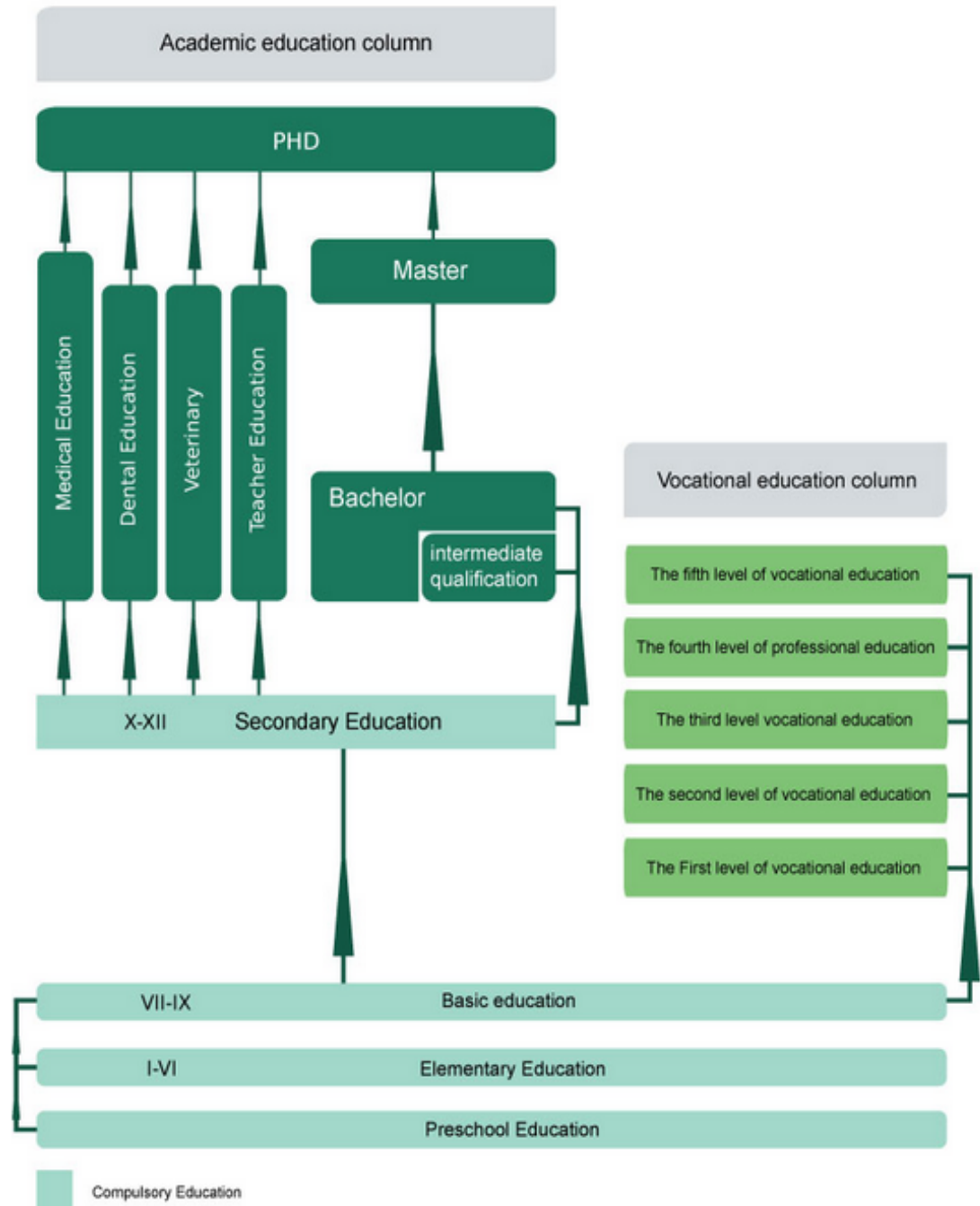

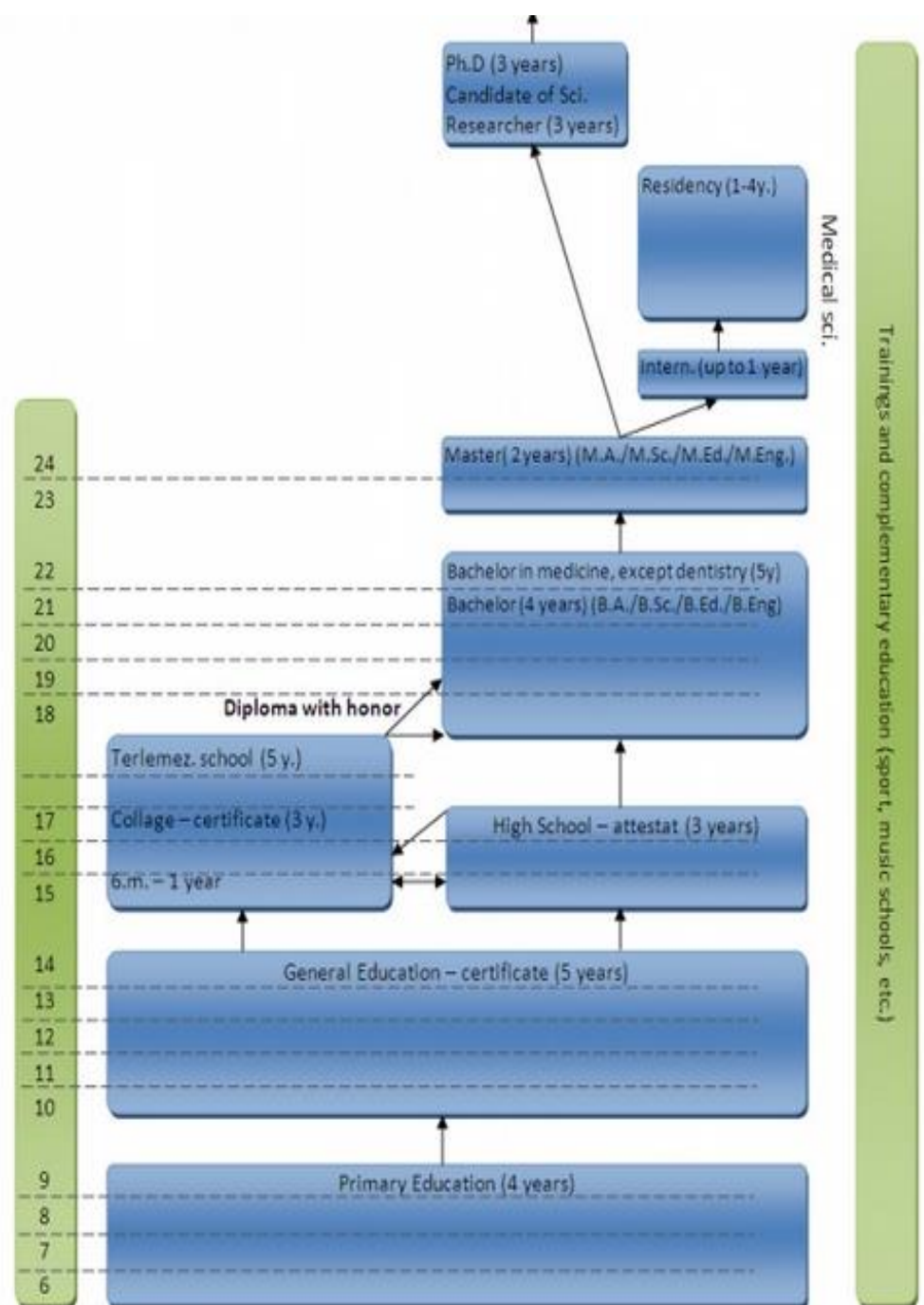

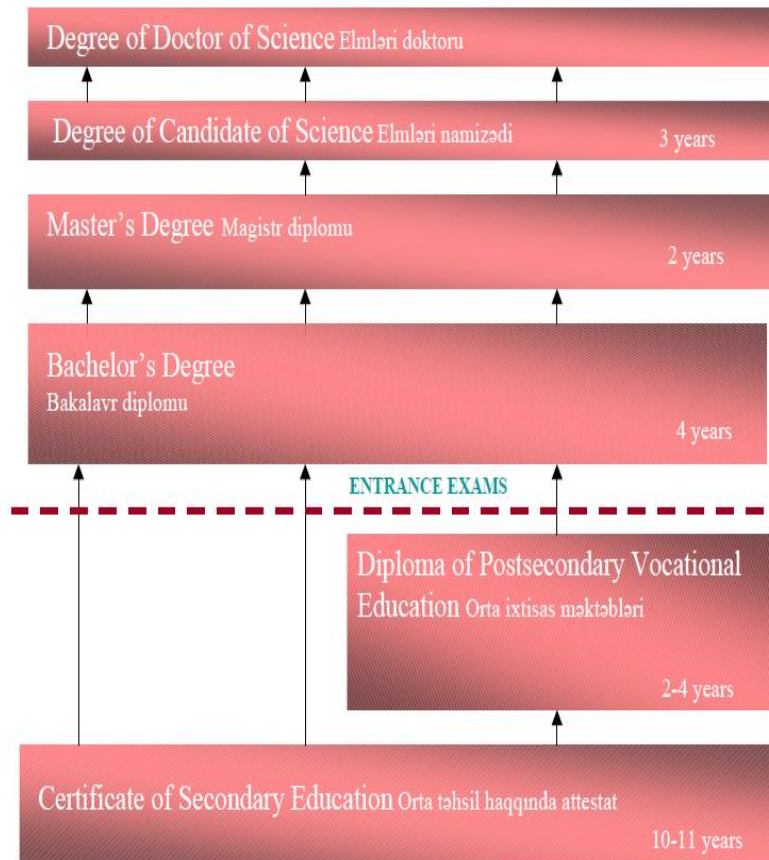

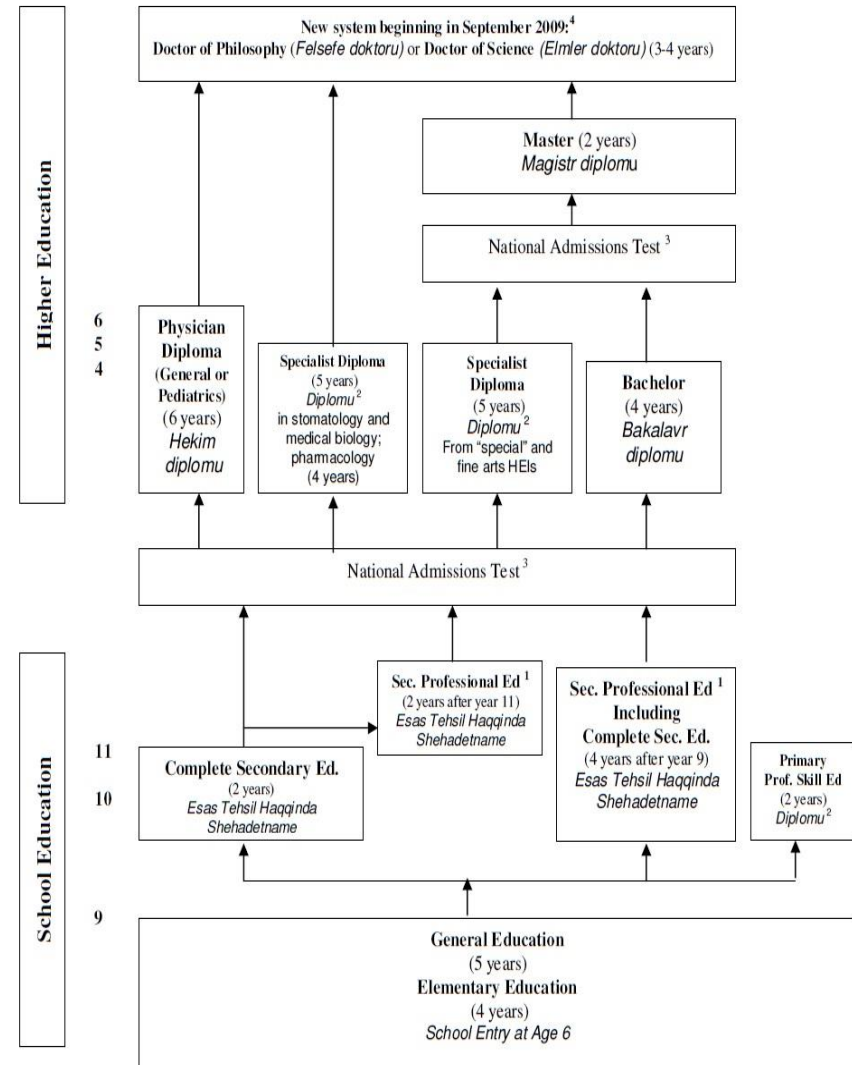

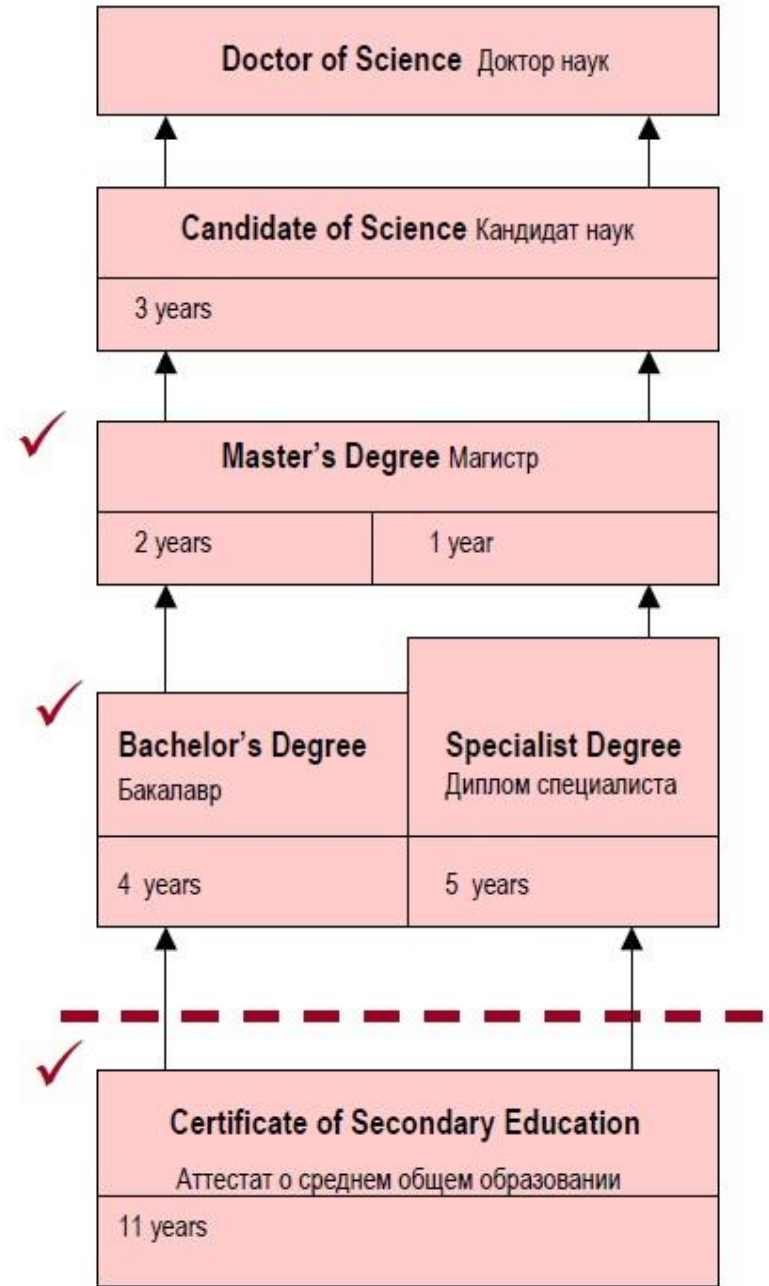


Educational System of Kyrgyzstan

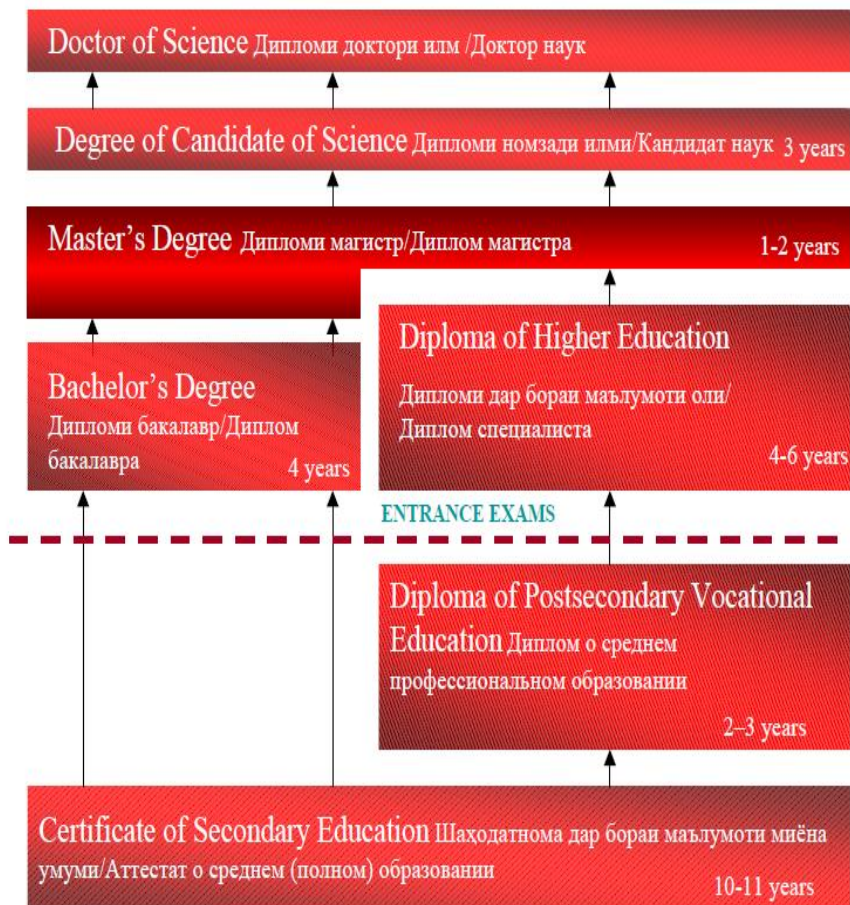

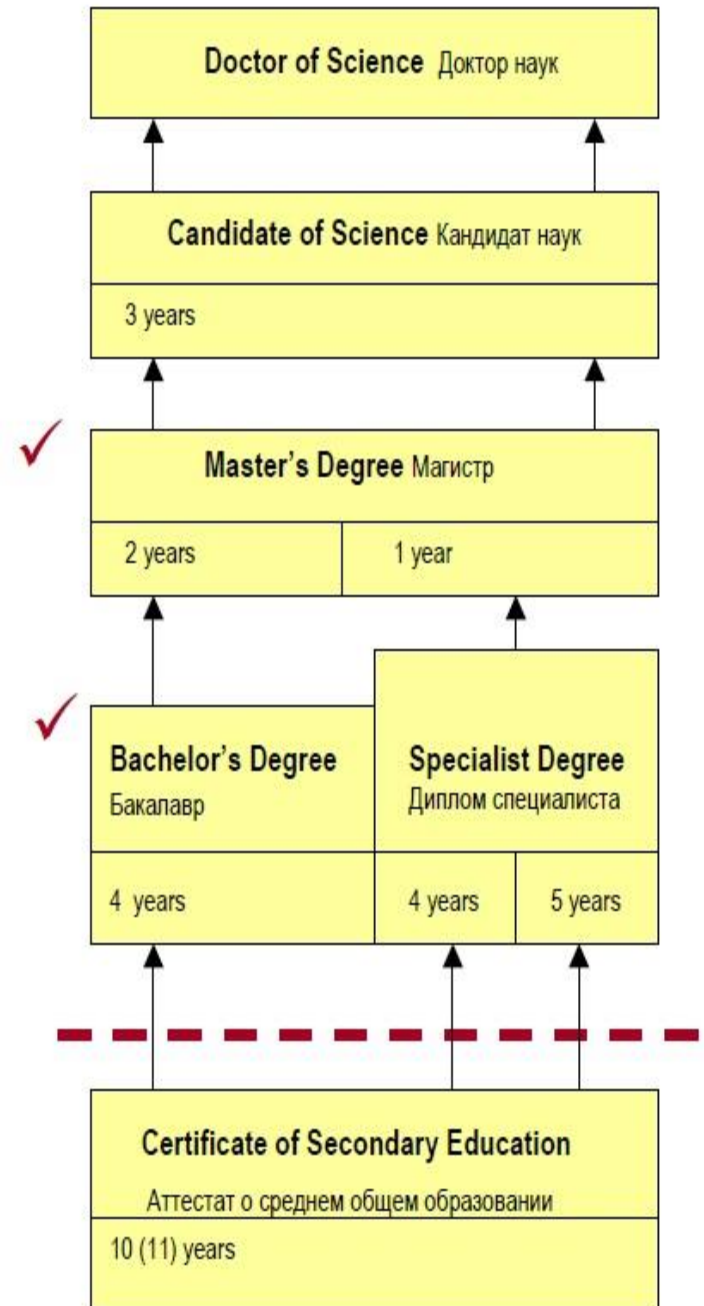


Educational System of Tajikistan
