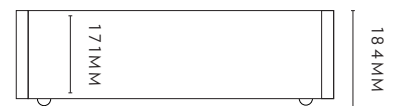

ASSEMBLY

Simple assembly required. We have designed the Slow Underbed Drawers to ensure it ships efficiently and is intuitive to assemble and disassemble.

CARE

For general care we recommend regular dusting with a clean, dry cloth, or wiping down with soft cloth wrung dry from plain water (leaving the surface dry after cleaning). Common stains can be removed with a damp cloth and should be attended to as soon as possible.

Solvents or direct heat will cause damage to your timber furniture.
