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



For 1966-77 Ford Bronco dashes, the holes for the original radio are already cut into your dash. The center hole is for the cable from the Motor 3 radio body, the Huntington radio face is also perfect for hot rods or custom flat dash applications where a low profile, custom appearance radio will fit in with the project.

any flat dash or custom solution Assemble the Motor 3's InfiniMount brackets and affix the shafts to the brackets using the dash or the Huntington radio face to match the shaft width. Using the included washers and nuts, mock up the mount and adjust the shaft depth to your preference. Once the install is done, use the included metal back strap (included with Motor 3) to secure the back of the radio body to the vehicle.
