Sri Lanka became part of that story. Wild and alive, yet deeply connected to nature, it taught me what it means to live with presence and purpose.



It came to life because of those who believed in Sippi before it existed, and stood by its vision.




We believe in challenging convention, not for the sake of being different, but to strive for more honesty and greater authenticity.

We honour character; the cracks, curves, and contours that make something entirely its own.








This chapter is a reflection of that idea: that beauty can emerge through the weathering of time, and meaning resonate through the patina of imperfection.








Some stories arrive as symbols. A ripple. A shell's curve. The gentle arc of a turtle's back, or the curl of a breaking wave.




Unlike our one-of-a-kind pieces, these designs can be recreated consistent in shape, but always made with care. They carry the spirit of the ocean's more familiar language: the creatures, the currents, the movement of water over time.

There's a lightness to them, a sense of ease. Some are playful nods to ocean life: a turtle, a spiral shell, the sway of seaweed. Others are more abstract, distilled down to the essence of flow and form.



They're sculptural, subtle reminders of the sea, wearable symbols of rhythm, connection, and calm.










Sri Lanka is renowned for its gems, their brilliance, colour, and cut. But beyond the surface lies something even more precious: potential.

lasting impression.





Through their unique presence, the jewellery tells a deeper story, one that goes beyond design








I was in Sri Lanka to get some distance between me and my everyday life to gain a fresh perspective.




