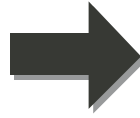


Rosemary Venison Dog Meal Recipe

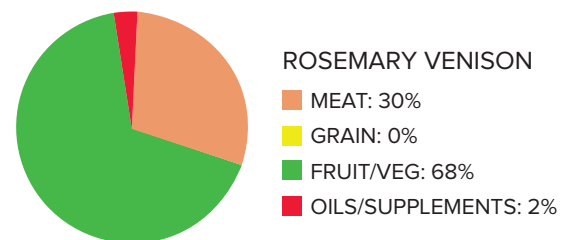
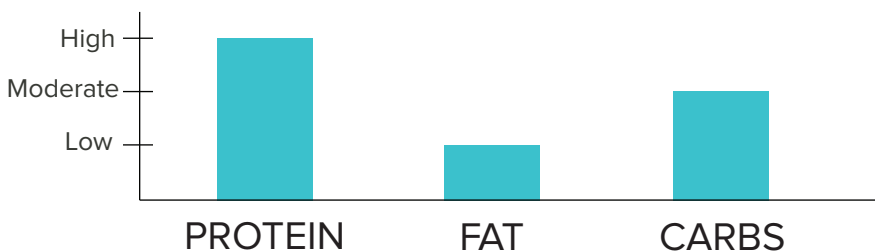
