



Size 7 needles US
Cotton or Cotton Linen Yarn
I like DK weight, but any weight will work.
If you use the standard cotton dishcloth yarn, your
dimensions will be a little larger, but that's just fine.

Gauge is not important for this project so just have fun.

Cast on 45 Stitches.

Knit 5 rows

All Right Side Rows: (Knit 4, Yarn over, Knit 1, Yarn over, Knit 4, slip 1, knit 2 together through the back loop, pass slipped stitch over) repeat 3 times. End with knit 4, yarn over, knit 1, yarn over, knit 4.

All Wrong Side Rows: Purl 2 together through the back loops, purl to the last 2 stitches, purl 2 together.

When your dishcloth is almost the length you want it (i usually stop at 18-20 repeats), knit 5 rows and bind off.



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Chevron Dishcloth

This is my favorite dishcloth to knit. The pattern is easy to remember but not boring. I like that the different textures help with scrubbing and the chevron pattern is pretty when the cloth is lying in wait for the next round of dishes.

I used Knitpicks Cotlin for the samples because I like the durability of the linen.
