Instructions for Setup

In this packet, you will find:

- 3 interjections games with directions
- Answer keys

Other materials you will need for setup:


- 2 dice
- Coin
- Counters
- 1 crayon, colored pencil, or marker per player
 - Each player needs a different color.
 - If you laminate the game boards, students should use dry-erase markers to play the game so that the game board can be erased.

Setting up your games:

- 1. Print each game board single-sided. Printing in color will look best, but printing in grayscale will be okay too.
- 2. Laminate each game board, if possible. That way, you will be able to use each game board for more than one round of play. Otherwise, you will need to have multiple copies of each game board on hand for your students to play.
- Any additional materials that are needed for each game are listed on the game itself. Gather those materials before playing.

Notes:

- The directions for each game are written on the game board so that students can check the directions at any time.
- All games are best played with 2 players.

(Identifying Interjections in Sentences)

The interjection is underlined in each sentence. The emotion of the

interjection (mild or strong) is in parentheses after each sentence.

(Using Interjections in Sentences)

Materials: Colored pencils (one color per player), two dice Object of the game: To be the player to capture the most squares. Directions: On your turn, roll both dice and add them together. Look for the sum of your dice in the chart in order to determine which interjection to use. Look for a sentence on the game board below that can use that interjection in the blank. You may draw ONE line connecting any two dots surrounding that sentence. When your line is the last to form a full square around a box, capture that square by coloring it in. The player who captures the most squares is the winner.

(Writing Sentences With Interjections)

Materials: Dice and counters (one color per player)

Object of the game: To be the first player to create a line of 4 boxes (vertically, horizontally, or diagonally).

Directions: On your turn, roll the dice. Look at the row for the number you rolled. Choose one of the available boxes in that row that you would like to answer. To answer that box, you must write a sentence using the word and the interjection given. If you write the sentence correctly, you may cover that box. If you write the sentence incorrectly, do not cover the box. The first player to cover a line of 4 boxes with his/her own counters is the winner. *Don't forget to use correct punctuation!*


Sample answers are provided below. The required words are underlined. There are many possibilities for each sentence.


