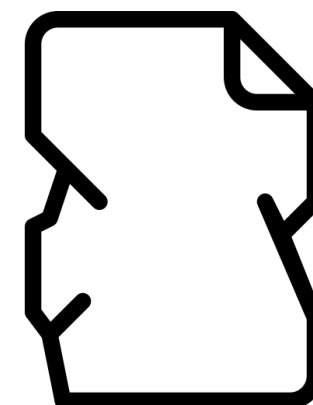


WHAT CAN BE RECYCLED?

PAPER

Dry paper and cardboard, that has not been contaminated by food, can be recycled at most recycling centers.

Examples: Newspapers, magazines, milk cartons, food boxes, and toilet roll inners.



METAL

Containers made out of aluminum and steel can be recycled. Ensure your containers are clean and dry before recycling.

Examples: Soft drink cans, food tins, and aerosol cans.



GLASS

Not only are glass containers reusable, but they are also easily recyclable. You can recycle glass bottles, jars, and containers. Broken glass cannot be recycled.

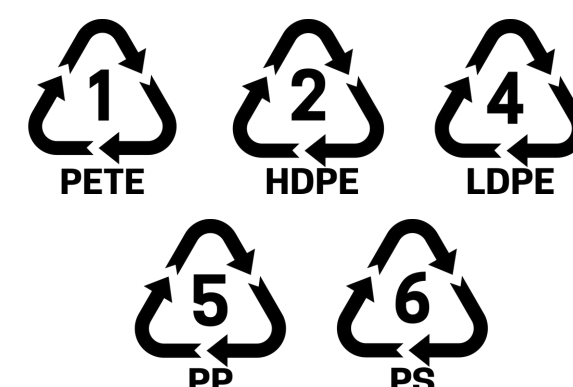
Examples: Glass bottles, jars, wine bottles etc.



PLASTIC

Plastic items with plastic code 1, 2, 4, 5 & 6 can be recycled.

Example: Newspapers, magazines, milk cartons, food boxes, and toilet roll inners.

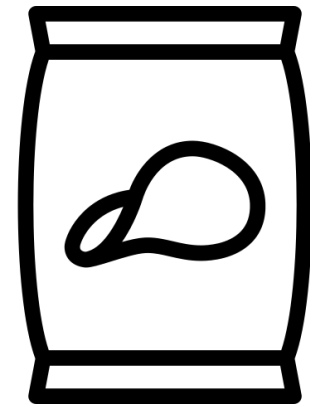


WHAT CANNOT BE RECYCLED?

CHIPS & SWEET WRAPPERS

These packets are made of composite plastic, where metallic foil and plastic have been combined to keep your food fresh.

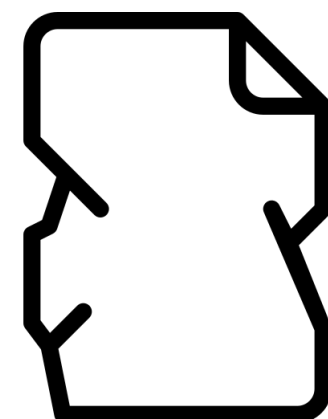
Examples: Potato chip packet, sweet wrappers, foiled coffee bags etc.



USED & DIRTY PAPER

Paper that is wet, or is contaminated with organic material cannot be recycled.

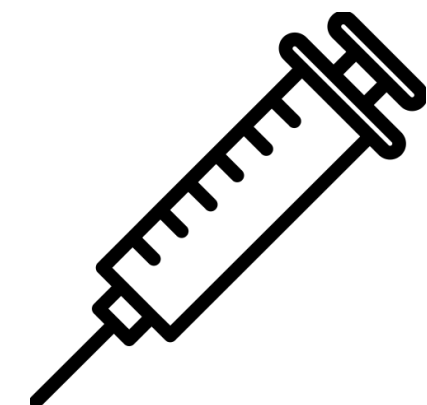
Examples: Used tissues, toilet paper, dirty pizza box, take-away containers stained with food.



HAZARDOUS WASTE

Cigarette buds, dirty nappies, medicine blister packs and any used medical waste cannot be recycled (eg. cotton swabs, needles, sanitary pads).

Please make sure that these items are disposed of in a responsible manner.



PLASTIC

Plastic items marked with code 3 and 7 are not commonly recycled.

Example: Cling wrap, pipes, tech cables, composite plastics etc.
