CONCRETE INFORMATION

BRADLEY Polished Concrete is an extremely versatile and durable material that can be used for a wide range of furnishings and architectural projects. Our Polished Concrete products are made from a unique artisan-made blend, and available in a range of designer colors and finishes that can fit many design styles. With proper care our Concrete products will last for many years, although subtle changes may occur to the appearance similar to any porous stone or ceramic material.

MATERIAL CHARACTERISTICS OF POLISHED CONCRETE

- Variations in color, grout density, porosity and surface luster can occur from lot-to-lot and may not be an exact match to showroom samples or digital representation of the color palette.
- Concrete products may have surface imperfections such as hairline cracks, depressions and
 discolorations; these variations are an expected and normal part of concrete furnishings but will
 not affect the integrity of the product and shall not be considered a manufacturing defect.
- Concrete furnishing products can be treated with one of our proprietary sealers depending on
 the application/ use. The addition of a sealer can improve the performance of the naturally
 porous surface by making it more resistant to staining, moisture, UV light or other elements, but
 in no way guarantees that the surface will be "stain proof" or prevent color changes that may
 naturally occur over time.
- Concrete products exposed to direct sunlight or kept in an outdoor environment may undergo a
 rapid color shift or develop other surface changes. There is no warranty against color or surface
 changes due to exposure to these conditions, and therefore Concrete is not recommended for
 outdoor use if appearance changes are objectionable.
- Concrete products are not warranted against fading, staining, discoloration, scratching or hairline cracks.
- If heavy or sharp objects are placed on a concrete top, felt or other suitable material should be used on the underside of the object to prevent scratching of the surface.
- Never leave a wet object on the surface of the concrete for an extended period. Objects like
 ceramic or terracotta plant pots can react with and draw moisture from the concrete slab and
 leave a permanent discoloration on the surface. Use a moisture resistant barrier between the
 pot and the concrete surface.
- Concrete furnishings are extremely heavy; it is up to the specifier to ensure the intended use
 and location are appropriate and capable of handling the enormous weight. Also consider this
 factor when budgeting labor for installation.
