

STEP 1: WARP THE LOOM

PATENT PENDIN




- 1. Thread a 2"/5 cm tail of the warp yarn through the hole from back to front. Make a tie then pull the end upwards to tighten the tie around the hole.
- 2. Pull the long end of the warp yarn <u>taut</u> to the <u>direct</u> opposite notch. Note: If the tie moves, simply hold it down with your finger as you complete 2 and 3.
- 3. Pull the warp yarn to the <u>right</u> around the back of (bottom) notches as the diagram above.
- 4. Pull taut to the angled opposite notch as the diagram above.
- 5. Pull the warp yarn to the <u>left</u> around the back of (top) notches as the diagram above, proceed to 6-42.
- 43. Pull the warp taut to the notch then cut 8"/20 cm tail. Bring the tail over the notch to the back.
- 44. Bring the tail lightly under the middle "intersection" of all the weft yarn. IMPORTANT: Do not pull tightly, work lightly.
- 45. Pull the tail over the last notch then thread the tail through the hole from back to front then loop the tail to make a tie. Pull upwards to tighten.

STEP 3: FINISH

OPTION 1: REMOVE FROM THE LOOM

- 1. With the tip of a needle, loosen then undo the ties around the hole then leave them until the last step. _ (1
- 2. Move to the direct opposit bottom notch and wedge the loop off the frame then cut the loop. At this point, you have two options A) tie a knot to close it or B) weave the ends into the stitches in the back of your woven eye.



- 3. Repeat step 2 throughout entire frame. At the end, you will have one extra loose end, weave this into a stitch.
- Optional: To turn this weaving into a badge, you can secure a backing onto the piece with glue and/or safety pin or sew it on.

OPTION 2: LEAVE ON THE LOOM

You can display or hang your eye on the loom. "Eye lashes" made with rya knots or tassels can also be added.



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
STEP 2: WEAVE THE EYE*

In addition to the eye, this frame can also weave a circle, a semi-cirle or an almond shape. Choose your circle(s) of choice.


1. For the pupil, thread a needle with 2'/61 cm of black yarn and start a tabby stitch. IMPORTANT: Start stitching further from center so you can track your over-under stitches then push and tighten your stitch into the center as you go.




2. For the iris and white, repeat step 1 and continue to stitch the eye out.



3. Optional: To fill in the dark blue, thread a needle with 4'/1.3 m of yarn and start a tabby stitch following the eye cut-out of the frame.



4. Once the dark blue is filled in above and below the eye ball, start stitching in the sides, one side at a time.



5. Flip the frame to the back side. Weave each loose end into the stitch one at a time. Cut the excess tails. NOTE: The loose ends for the pupil/black may be very tight and difficult to weave into a stitch, you can simply trim the tail to .25"/.6 cm and leave it.
