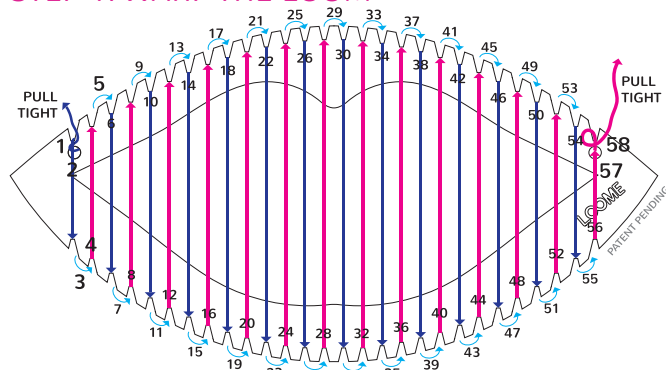


LOOME LIP LOOM HOW-TO

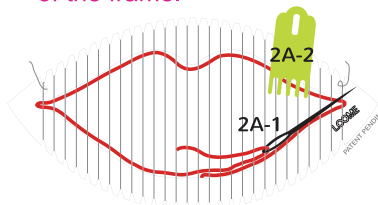
STEP 1: WARP THE LOOM



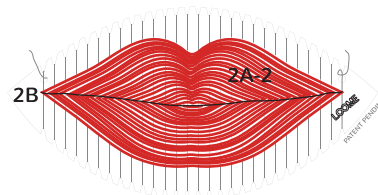
1. Thread a 2"/5 cm tail of the warp yarn through the hole from back to front. Make a tie then pull the end upwards to tighten the tie around the hole.
2. Pull the long end of the warp yarn taut to the opposite notch. Note: If the tie moves, simply hold it down with your finger as you complete 2 and 3.
3. Pull the warp yarn around the back of (bottom) notch 1 and 2.
4. Pull taut to the direct opposite notch.
5. Pull the warp yarn around the back of (top) notch 2 and 3 then pull taut to the opposite notch, proceed to 6-56.
57. Pull the warp taut towards to hole, cut a 5"/13 cm tail.
58. Thread the tail through the hole from front to back then loop the tail to the front to make a tie. Pull upwards to tighten.

STEP 2A: WEAVE LIP*

1. Thread a needle with 4"/1.3 m of yarn and start a tabby stitch following the lip cut-out of the frame.



2. Use the weaving comb to push the yarn into place. Repeat 1 and 2 until the lip is completely filled (below).



STEP 2B: WEAVE LIP LINE

1. Thread a needle with 2"/6 m of yarn and start a tabby stitch across the middle of the lip. For stronger lip line definition, go across 2-3 times.

STEP 2C: WEAVE ENDS

1. Flip the frame to the back side. Weave each loose end into the stitch one at a time. Cut the excess tails.

STEP 3: FINISH

OPTION 1: REMOVE FROM THE LOOM

1. With the tip of a needle, loosen then undo the tie around the first hole (left side).
2. With the tip of a needle, pull the warp off the bottom notch 1 and 2. With one hand, lightly lay your fingers on the weaving and with the other, slowly pull the end of the tail up so the bottom loop becomes flush to the weaving.
3. Continue to work lightly and slowly, repeat 2 for the top notch and continue to alternate this action for the bottom then the top. IMPORTANT: When you reach the middle of the top lip, pull the notch more snug than usual, this will create the dip on the upper lip.
4. When you reach the end, cut the warp leaving 4"/10 cm tail. Weave the tail into a stitch then cut the excess.
5. Optional: To turn this weaving into a badge, you can secure a backing onto the piece with glue and/or safety pin or sew it on.

OPTION 2: LEAVE ON THE LOOM

You can display or hang your woven lips on the loom.

WHAT YOU'LL NEED:

1. Cotton Warp Yarn
2. Yarn
3. Needle
4. Weaving Comb/Beater
5. Scissors
