

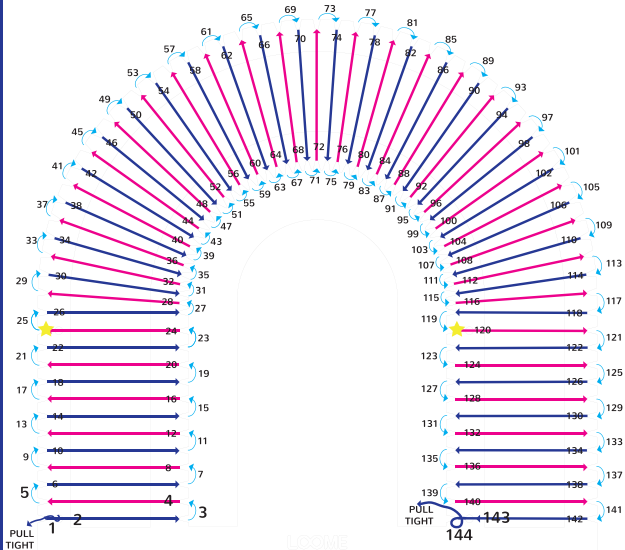

RAINBOW/ARCH

LOOM HOW-TO

STEP 1: WARP THE LOOM (5-10 mins)

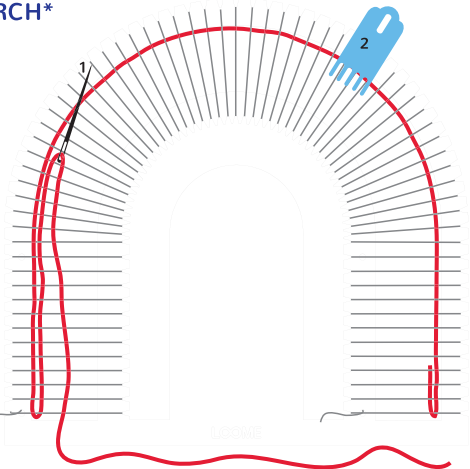


1. Thread a 2⁷/₅ cm tail of the warp through the hole from back to front. Make a tie then pull the end away to tighten the tie around the hole. TIP: Once the tie is made, use a small piece of tape to further secure tie. NOTE: To make a smaller rainbow/arch, start at the ★ noted in the diagram.
2. Pull the long end of the warp yarn taut to the opposite notch.
NOTE: If the tie moves, simply hold it down with your finger as you complete 2 and 3.
3. Pull the warp yarn around the back of notch 1 and 2 (as pictured in the diagram above).
4. Pull taut to the direct opposite notch.
5. Pull the warp yarn around the back of notch 2 and 3 on the other side then pull taut to the opposite notch, proceed to 6-142.
NOTE: For smaller rainbow, proceed to the hole with the ★ and follow the instructions for the next two steps below.
143. Pull the warp taut towards the hole, cut a 5⁷/₁₃ cm tail.
144. Thread the tail through the hole from front to back then loop the tail to the front to make a tie. Pull to tighten. TIP: Once the tie is made, use a small piece of tape to further secure tie.

STEP 2: WEAVE RAINBOW/ARCH*

1. Thread a needle with 4¹/_{1.3} m of yarn and start a tabby stitch following the rainbow/arch cut-out.
2. Use the weaving comb to push the yarn into place.
3. Continue stitching and switching yarn colors as desired until the rainbow/arch cut-out area is completely filled-in

STEP 3: FINISH OPTION: REMOVE FROM THE LOOM

1. With the tip of a needle, loosen then undo the tie around the first hole (left side).
2. With the tip of a needle, pull the warp off the first two notches on the opposite side. With one hand, lightly lay your fingers on the weaving with the other, slowly pull the end of the tail so the loop becomes flush to the weaving.
3. Continue to work lightly and slowly, repeat 2 for the top notch and continue to alternate this action for the loom. TIP: Using your needle to help pull the loop can be easier than using your fingers.
4. When you reach the end, cut the warp leaving 4⁷/₁₀ cm tail.
5. Flip the loom to the back side and stitch each tail into the weave then cut the excess.
6. Optional: To turn this weaving into a badge, you can secure a backing onto the piece with glue and/or safety pin or sew it on.

OPTION 2: LEAVE ON THE LOOM

You can display or hang your woven rainbow/arch on the loom. Make sure that flip the loom to the back side and stitch each tail into the weave then cut the excess into the weave.

WHAT YOU'LL NEED:

1. Cotton Warp Yarn
2. Yarn
3. Needle
4. Weaving Comb/Beater
5. Scissors
