## RING SIZING GUIDE

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## CHECK YOUR CURRENT RING

If you have a ring that fits well on the same finger that is a similar width to the one you are considering, place it on the circles above: match it to the closest circle to find the size. If the ring you are checking is narrower than the ring you desire, go up a full size.

The edges of the ring should sit right inside the edge of the circle.
Confirm that the circles have not been resized during printing by placing a dime on the circle at the bottom of the page: it should be the same size.


Compare widths: if the ring you want is 4 mm (left) and the one you are sizing is wider than that, go up a size.


## PAPER SIZER

Confirm that the circle at the bottom of this page has not been resized during printing by placing a dime on it and checking to see if it is the same size.
Cut the slim strip of paper out and wrap it around the finger you will wear the ring on, with the left edge covering the right. The highest number you can see should be your ring size for a narrow to standard (up to 4 mm ) band: make a quick mark on the paper sizer.
Tape the circle in place and make sure it can slide over your knuckle without tearing. Paper is less flexible and does not compress the skin as metal does, so this method will likely yield a larger ring size.

If you are in between two sizes, choose the larger.
If you are ordering a wide band (wider than 4 mm ), go up a full size to ensure that it fits.
