## Heating Flexique Instant Lace:

*Microwave Instructions* - Using a microwave safe container, such as the one in which the product arrives, heat desired amount for up to 15 seconds and stir.

Repeat until it becomes completely liquid. Do not overheat. Boiling may cause it to overflow. Temperature will reach approximately 140 degrees F (60°C).

**TIP:** place the container on a clean, dry surface when heating, so that any accidental overflows can be reused. Once set, place overflowed product back in the container and reheat with the rest of the Lace.

**Note:**

- based on a 950-watt microwave. Adjust your heating times if your microwave's wattage differs.
- if you mix smaller quantities you'll want to start with lower heating times to avoid overflowing.

## Adjusting Appearance/Flavor:

Without additives, Flexique Instant Lace is translucent with a yellowish tint, and has a neutral, semi-sweet taste. Adding white will make it opaque.

Add a few drops (it doesn't take much!) of your favorite edible coloring medium and/or flavoring to Flexique Lace after it's heated, while it's in a liquid state. Mix thoroughly, making sure to mix in the corners of your container.

Luster can be either mixed in at this point, or dusted/brushed on once the Lace has returned to a solid state (while it's still tacky).

## Using Flexique Instant Lace in Lace Molds or Other Thin Molds:

**TIP:** For best results put a small amount of shortening onto your finger tips and lightly rub it onto the top surface of your mold before you pour the Lace mixture into it.

Pour the liquid lace onto the mold and use a stiff plastic scraper to wipe off the top, using gentle pressure and working quickly before the lace cools.

Fill your mold completely. Inspect your mold, then fill in any gaps by pouring in additional liquid lace and gently scraping off the fresh product.

Let it dry for at least 15 minutes before taking out of the mold. Refrigerating will expedite drying time.

*LaceLink:* Sections of dried Lace can be joined together by lining up the sections and applying a bit of warmed Lace with an artist brush to seal the seam. Make one long continuous piece, or seamlessly join lace that's been wrapped around a cake. Let cool before moving.

Note: some shrinkage may occur during the first 24 hours as the water evaporates. For detailed information, including how to prevent shrinkage, visit [flexique.com/noshrink](http://flexique.com/noshrink)

Flexique Lace can be stored on the shelf. No refrigeration is necessary.
