

## BLIND STITCH BRAIDER

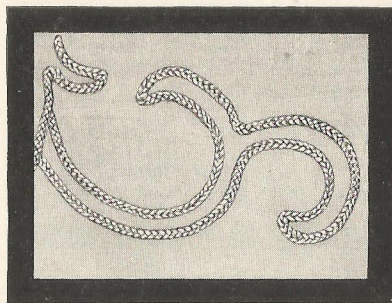


FIG. 205. WORK DONE BY

The Blind Stitch Braider attachment, No. 121614 shown in Fig. 204, is furnished in three sizes:  $\frac{3}{32}$  inch,  $\frac{1}{8}$  inch and  $\frac{5}{32}$  inch, and size desired should be specified when ordering. This Braider is very useful for braiding designs, where the stitching should not show. The proper size of pigtail, rat-tail or soutache braid should be used with the appropriate Braider. Fig. 205 shows a sample of the work that can be simply and easily done with the Braider.

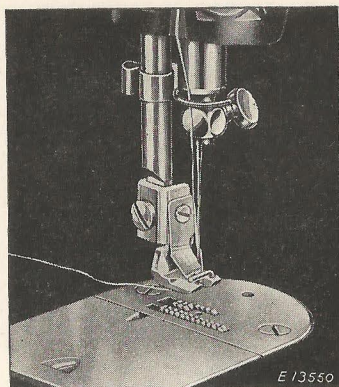

### Attaching the Blind Stitch Braider

Place the Braider on the presser bar in the same manner as the presser foot. Turn the spring to the right and insert braid through the hole from the back to the front, between the toes and back under the foot. Turn spring all the way down again, over the braid. Place material under the braider, with the place where stitching should begin directly under the needle, and lower presser bar.

See that the needle comes down close to the edge of the braid and regulate tensions to get the desired effect. A loose tension will allow the braid to be rather flat and a tight tension will make it stand up on edge. The needle catches the under side of the braid, thus permitting the outline to be followed while all stitches are concealed.

The Tubular Trimming Attachment No. 35985, shown in Fig. 206, is furnished in three sizes,  $\frac{3}{32}$  inch,  $\frac{1}{8}$  inch and  $\frac{5}{32}$  inch, and orders should specify which size is desired.
